The Abademy Trust's object ("the Object") is specifically restricted to the following: to advance for the public benefit education in the United Kingdom, in particular but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing by establishing, maintaining, rarrying on, managing and developing a school with a designated Couran of England religious character effering a broad and balanced currictions conducted in accordance with the principles, practices and tenets of the Church of England both generally and in particular in relation to arranging for refigious exampling and regard to the advice of the Crocasan Board of Education ("the Abademy").
- In furtherance of the Object but not ruther or otherwise the Adsorpting Trust, may
 exercise the following powers:-
 - (a) to draw. make, suscept, endorse, discount, execute and issue cromissory notes bills, choques and other instruments, and to operate bank accounts in the name of the Academy Trust;
 - (b) to raise funds and to invite and receive contributions provided that in raising funds the Academy Trust shall not undertake any substantial permanent frading activities and shall conform to any relevant statutory regulations:

- (d) subject to Article 3 below to employ such staff, as are necessary for the proper pursuit of the Collect (including the maintenance of an offective Charch of England office) and to make all reasonable and necessary provision for the payments of pensions and superannuation to staff and their dependents:
- (e) to establish on support, whether financially or otherwise, any charteble trusts, sesociations or institutions formed for all or any of the Object;
- (f) to co-operate with other charities, other independent and maintained schools, voundary bodies and stability suthorities operating in furtherance of the Object and to exchange information and advice with them;
- (g) to pay out of funds of the Academy Trust the costs, charges and expenses of and incidental to the formal on and registration of the Academy Trust;
- (h) to establish, malnish, carry on, manage and develop the Academy at St Vincent Street West, Ladywood, Sirmingham B16 8AN;
- (i) to offer schoerships, exhibitions, prizes and awards to pupils and former pupils, and otherwise to encourage and assist pupils and former pupils;
- ii) to provide educations facilities and services to students of all ages and the wider community for the public benefit;
- (k) to carry out research into the development and application of new lookingues in education in particular in rotation to the areas of curricular specialisation of the Academy and to its approach to curriculum development and devivery and to publish the results of such research, and to develop means of cenefiting from application of the experience of industry, commerce, other schools and the vertextary sector to the education of pupils in ecademies.
- (i) subject to such consonts as may be required from the Trustees or otherwise required by law and/or by any contract entered into by or on Schalf of the Adademy Trust to control and raise money for the furtherance of the Object in such mannerand on such security as the Adademy Trust may think fit;

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- (m) to decosit or invest any funds of the Academy Trust not immediately required for the furtherance of its Object (but to troops only after obtaining such advice from a financial expert as the Governors consider secessary and having regard to the sultability of Investments and the need (or diversification);
- (ii) to delegate the management of investments to a financial excert, but only on terms that:
 - the Investment policy is set down in writing for the financial expert by the Governors;
 - every transaction is reported promothy to the Governors;
 brd performance of the invostments is reviewed regularly with the Governors;
 - (iii) the Governors are entitled to control the delagation arrangement at any time;

 - (vi) the financial expert must not do anything nuising the powers of the Governors

- (p) to provide indominity insurance to cover the liability of Governors which by virtue of any rule of law would observice attach to them in respect of any negligence. default, include of final or breach of July of which they may be guilty at relation to the Academy Trust: Provided that any such Insurance shall not extend to any claim arising from any action omission which the Governors knew to be a breach of trust or breach of duty or which was committed by the Governors in reckless disregate of whether it was a breach of trust or breach of duty or not and provided also that any such insurance shall not extend to the costs of any unsuccessful defence to a color and provided in brought against the Governors in their cagacity as Governors:

- (r) to be all such other levels things as are necessary for or are incidented to be conductive to the achievement of the Object and appropriate to the ratigious character of the Academy.

- A Covernor may benefit from any indemnity insurance purchased at the Academy Treats expense to cover the liability of the Governors which by virtue of any rule of law would otherwise attach to them in respect of any negligence, default or breach of trust or breach of duty of which they may be guilty in relation to the Academy Trust: Provided that any such insurance shall not extend to any claim prising from any act or onlission which the Governors know to be a breach of trust or breach of duty or which was committed by the Governors in reckless disregard to whether it was a breach of trust or breach of duty or not and provided also that any such insurance shall not extend to the costs of any unsuccessful defence to a oth half prospection brought against the Governors in their respectly as directors of the Academy Trust.

- 6.4 A company, which has shares listed on a recuguised stock exchange and of which any one Governor holds no more than 1% of the issued capital of that company, may receive fees, remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth from the Apademy Trust
- 5.5 A Governor may at the discretion of the Governors as reinbursed from the property of the Academy Trust for reasonable expenses graphily incurred by him or her when acting on behalf of the Academy Trust, but excluding expenses in connection with foreign travel.

3.6 No Governor may:

- (a) buy any goods or services from the Academy Trust;
- (b) sell goods, services, or any interest in land to the Academy Trust,

Parent Governors which is contested shall be held by secret ballot.

- 55. The arrangements made for the election of a Perent Sovernor shall provide for every person who is entitled to vote in the election to have an apportunity to do so by post or, if the prefers, by baying his callot paper returned to the Adademy Trust by a registered pool at the Academy.
- So. Where a vacancy for a Parent Governor is required to the fillowing election, the Governing Body shall take such steps as are reasonably practical to secure that every person who is known to them to be a parent of a registered pupilial the Academy is informed of the vacancy and that it is required to be filled by election, informed that he is enlitted to sland as a condidate, and vale at the election, and given an opportunity to do so.
- 57. The number of Parent Governors required shall be made up by Parent Governors appointed by the Governing Body if the number of parents standing for election is less than the number of vacancies.
- 58. In appointing a Parent Governor the Governing Body shall appoint a corson who is the parent of a registered cupil at the Adademy; or where it is not reasonably specifical to do so, a person who is the parent of a child of compulsory actual age.

CO-OPTED SOVERNORS

59. The Governors appointed under Article 50 with the consent of the Djoceson Board of Education may appoint up to 2 Co-opied Governors for such term (not exceeding four years) and otherwise upon such conditions as they shall think till. A 'Co-opied Governor' means a person who is appointed to be a Governor by being Co-opied by Governors who have not themselves been so appointed. The Governors may not co-opt an employed of the Academy Trust as a Co-opted Governor (this box the number of Governors who are employees of the Academy Trust would exceed one third of the total number of Governors (posturing the Principal).

APPOINTMENT OF ADDIT ONAL COVERNORS.

- 60. The Secretary of State may give a warring notice to the Governors (which he shall copy to the Discessif Board of Education) where he is self-sted—

 - c) the period within which that action is to be taken by the Clovercora (the compilance period).
- 62. The Secretary of State may appoint such Additional Governors as no blinks fit (after consultation with the Diccosan Poard of Education) if the Secretary of State has:
 - e) given the Governors a warning notice in accordance with Article 00; and
 - b) the Governors have falled to comply, or secure compliance, with the notice to the Secretary of State's setIsfaction within the compliance period.
- 1.ne Secretary of State may also appoint such Additional Governors (after consodation with the Discessa Joand of Education) where following as inspection by the Chief trapactor in accordance with the Education Act 2005 (an "inspection") the Adademy Trust receives an Ofsted grading (being a grade reformed to in The Framework for School Inspection or any modification or replacement of that document for the time being to force) which amounts to a drop, either from one Inspection to the next Inspection or convean any two inspections carried out within a 5 year period of two Ofsted grades. For the outposes of the foregoing the grade received by St John's Lacywood Church of England Primary School shall be regarded as the grade received by the Academy.
- 63. The Secretary of State may also epocht such Further Governors as he thinks fit (after consultation with the Diocesar, Board of Education) if a Special Measures. Termination Event (as defined in the Funding Agreement) notices is respect of the

64. Within 3 days of the Secretary of State appointing any Additional or Further Governors in accordance with Addices 82, 62A or 63, any Governors appointed under Article 50 and hobing office immediately preceding the appointment of such Governors, shall resign immediately and the Vembers' power to appoint Governors under Article 50 shall remain suspenced until the Secretary of State removes one or more of the Additional or Fugher Governors.

TERM OF OFFICE.

65. RESIGNATION AND REMOVAL

- 71. A Governor shall coase in hold office differ is absent without the permassion of the Governora from all their meetings field within a period of six modifier and the Sovernors resolve that his office he vacated.
- 72. A person shan be disqualified from hokking or continuing to hold office as a Governor if—
 - a) his estate has been sequestrated and the sequestration has not been discharged, annulied or reduced; or
 - b) he is the subject of a benkruptcy rostrictions order or an intering order.
- 73. A person shall be disqualified from holding or continuing to hold office as a Governor at any time when he is subject to a disqualification order or a disqualification undertaking under the Company Directors Disqualification Act 1966 or to an order mede under section 429(2)(b) of the Insolvency Act 1968 (failure to pay under county court acministration order).
- 74. A Governor shall conse to next office if he despes to be a Governor by virtue of any provision in the Companies Act 2006 or is disqualified from acting as a flustee by virtue of section 72 of the Charities Act 1993 (or any statutory re-enactment or modification of that provision).
- A person shall be disqualified from holding or northwise to hold office as a Governor if he has been removed from the office of charity trusted or frustoe for a charity by an order made by the Charity Commission of the High Court on the grounds of any misconduct or mamanagement is the administration of the charity for which he was responsible or to which he was prive, or which he by his conduct contributed to or facilitated.
- 75. A person shall be disqualified from holding or from continuing to hold office as a Governor at any time when he is:
 - is) included in the fat kept by the Secretary of State ender section 1 of the Protection of Children Act 1999; or

- b) disqualified from working with children in accordance with Section 35 of the Criminal Juglius and Court Services Act 2000; or

- 77. A person shall be disquallf at from holding or continuing to hold office as a Governor If he is a person in respect of whom a direction has each mode taken section 142 of the Education Act 2002 or is subject to any prohibition or restriction which takes effect as a contained in such a direction.
- A person shall be disqualified from holding or continuing to hold office as a Governor where he has, at any time, been convicted of any triminal offence, excluding any that have been spent under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 as amended, and excluding any offence for which the maximum sentence is a fine of a lesser sentence except where a person has been convicted of any offence which falls under section 73 of the Charlifes Act 1993.

- 84. Subject to Article 35, the chairman or vice-chairman shall hold office as such until his successor has been elected in eccordance with Article 58.
- 85. The chairman or vice-or arman may at any time resign his office by giving notice in writing to the Secretary. The chairman or vice-or arman shall cease to had office ?

- Where the chairman is absent from any meeting or there is at the time a vacancy in the office of the chairman, the vice-chairman shall act as the chair for the purposes of the meeting.
- 68. Where in the continuous tances referred to in Article 87 the vice-chairman is also obsent from the meeting or thore is at the films a vacancy in the office of vice-chairman, the Governors shall elect one of their number to act as a chairman for the purposes of that mooting provided (way the Governor elected shall not be a person who is employed by the Academy Frust.

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- 89. The Secretary shall act as anatomen during that part of any meeting at which the charman's elected.
- 90. Any election of the chairman or vice-chairman which is contested shall be hald by secret ballot.

POWERS OF GOVERNORS

- Subject to provisions of the Companies Act 2006, the Articles and to any directions given by special resolution, the business of the Academy Trust shall be managed by the Gravemors who may exercise at the powers of the Academy Trust. No alteration of the Articles and no such direction stall invalidate any prior act of the Governors which would have been valid if that afteration had not been made or that direction had not been given. The powers given by this Article shall not be limited by any special power given to the Sovernors by the Articles and a meeting of Governors at which a quoryth is present may exercise ail the powers exercisable by the Governors.
- 95. In addition to all powers hereby expressly conferred upon them and without detracting from the ponersity of their powers under the Articles the Governors shall have the following powers, namely:

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- a) to expend the funds of the Academy Trust in such manner as they shall consider most beneficial for the schlevement of the Object and to invest in the name of the Academy Trust such test of the funds as they may see fit and to direct the sale or transposition of any such investments and to expend the proceeds of any such sale in full herance of the Object, and
- by to enjoying contracts on bahalf of the Academy Trust.
- 56. In the exercise of their powers and functions, the Governors may consider any advice naven by the Principal and any other executive officer.
- 97. Any pank account in which any money of the Academy Trust is deposited shall be operated by the Governors in the name of the Academy Trust. All cheques and orders for the payment of money from such an account shall be signed by all least two signalcries authorised by the Governors.

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST.

- Any Governor who has or can have any direct or indirect duty or personal interest (Including out not limited to any Personal Financial Interest) which conflicts or may conflict with his duties as a Governor shall disclose that fact to the Governors as each as his becomes aware of it. A Governor must absent bimaelf from any discussions of the Governors in which it is possible that a conflict will shae between his duty to act solely in the interests of the Academy Trust and any duty or commal interest (including but not limited to any Personal Financial Interest).
- 99. For the purpose of Arline 98, a Governor has a Personal Financial Interest in the employment or remuneration of, or the provision of any other bondit to, that Odvernor as permitted by and as defined by articles 6.6-6.9.

THE MINUTES

- The minutes of the proceedings of a meeting of the Covernors shall be drawn up and entered into a track kept for the purpose by the person acting as Secretary for the purposes of the mooting; and shall be eighed (subject to the approval of the Governors) at the same or next subsequent meeting by the person acting as chairman thereof. The infinites shall include a record of:
 - a) at appointments of officers made by the Governors; and

b) all proceedings at meetings of the Academy Trust and of the Governors and of committees of Governors including the names of the Governors present at each such meeting.

COMMITTEES

101. Subject to these Articles, the Governors may establish any committee. Subject to these Articles, the constitution, membership and proceedings of any committee shall be determined by the Governors. The establishment, terms of reference, constitution and membership of any committee of the Governors shall be reviewed at least order in every twelve menths. The membership of any committee of the Governors may include cersons who are not Governors provided that a majority of members of any alich committee shall be Governors. The Governors may determine that some or all of the members of a committee who are not Governors shall be entitled to vote in any proceedings of the committee. No vote on any matter shall be taken at a meeting of a committee of the Governors unless the majority of members of the committee present are Governors.

CELECATION.

- 102. In a Governors may delegate to any Governor, committee, the Principal or any other holder of an executive office, such of their powers or functions as they consider desirable to be exercised by them. Any such delegation may be made subject to any conditions the Governors may impose and may be revoked or altered.
- 103. Where any power or function of the Governors is exercised by any committee, any Governor, Páncipal or any other no der of an executive office, that person or committee shall report to the Governors in respect of any solice taken or decision made with respect to the exercise of that power or function at the meeting of the Governors immediately following the taking of the action or the making of the decision.

PRINCIPAL AND STAFF

194. The Governora with the consent of the Diocesan Board of Education and having made use of their powers under \$124A of the School Standards and Francework Ard 1996shall appoint the Principal. The Governors may delegate such powers and functions as they consider are required by the Principal for the Internal organisation, management and control of the Academy (including the implementation of all colicies

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approved by the Governors and for the direction of the teaching and curriculum at the Academy).

104A, in appointing staff the governors will have regard to their powers under s124A of the School Standards and Framework Act 1995 and to their power to deciste a Genuine Occupational Requirement for non-teaching appointments where they believe this to be justified.

MEETINGS OF THE GOVERNORS.

- 106. Cach Governor shall be given at least fourteen dear days before the bate of a meeting in
 - a) notice in writing thereof, signed by the Serzetary, and sent to each Governor at the address provided by sent Governor from time to lime, and
 - b) a copy of the sgenda for the moeting;

- 113. ANNUAL RETURN.

The Governors shall comply with their obligations under Paul 24 of the Companies Act 2006 (or any esalutory re-ensetment or modification of that Act) with regard to the preparation of an account fedure to the Registrar of Companies and to accommonda with the Statement of Recommended Practice as if the Accounty Trust was a conexampt charity and to the Secretary of State and the Principal Regulator by 31 December each Accounty Financial Year.

NOTICES

- Any milition to be given to on by any passon pursuant to the Arthdes (other than a notice dating a meeting of the Governors) shall be jut writing or shall be given using electronic communications to an address for the time being confided for that purpose to the person giving the notice. In these Articles, "Address" in relation to electronic communications, includes a number or address used for the purposes of such communications.
- 130. RULES.

- 134. The Governors may from time to time make such rules or bye laws as they may deets nocessary or expedient or convenient for the propor conduct and management of the Academy Trust, and in particular bitt without prejudice to the governity of the foregoing, they may by such rules or bye laws regulator.
 - at the setting askle of the whole or any part or parts of the Academy Toust's premises at any perfects/time or times or for any particular purpose or purposes;
 - In the procedure at meetings of the Governors and committees of the Governors in so far as such procedure is not regulated by the Articles; and
 - c. generally, all such meters as are commonly the subject marker of company

135. The Academy Trest in general meeting shall have power to alter, add or to repeat the rules or bye laws but only with the consent of the Diocesan Board of Education. Provided that no rule or bye law shall be inconsistent with, or shall affect or receal anything contained in the Articles.

- 138. No person who is a Local Authority Associated Person is eligible to be appointed in the office of Covernor unless his accointment to such office is authorised by the local authority to which he is associated.

Annex B

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ADMISSION OF PUPILS TO THE ST JOHN'S AND ST PETER'S C OF E ACADEMY

GENERAL

- 1. This annex may be amended in writing at any time by agreement between the Secretary of State and the Academy Trust.
- 2. Except as provided in paragraphs 2A to 2B below the Academy Trust will act in accordance with, and will ensure that an Independent Appeal Panel is trained to act in accordance with, all relevant provisions of the School Admissions Code, and the School Admission Appears Code published by the Deportment for Education ("the Codes") as they apply at any given time to maintained schools and with equalities law and the law on admissions as they apply to maintained schools. For this purpose, reference in the Codes or legislation to fadmission authorities" shall be dearned to be references to the governing body of the Academy Trust.
- The Academy Trust is permitted to determine admission arrangements (subject to consultation in accordance with the School Admissions Code) that give priority for admission (but not above looked after children and previously looked after children) to other children attracting the pupil premium, including the service premium (the pupil premium admission criterion). Where an Academy Trust exercises this freedom it will provide information in its admission arrangements of eligibility for the premiums.
- 28 For the purposes of applying the pupit premium admission criterion only, sections 1.9(f) and 2.4(a) of the School Admissions Code do not apply insofar as they prevent admission authorities from giving priority to children according to the financial or accupational status of parents or using supplementary forms that ask for
 - any personal details about their financial status; or
 - whether parents are serving in the armed forces (of any nation), stationed in England, and exercising parental care and responsibility for the child in question.
- 3. Notwithstanding the generality of paragraph 2 of this Adnex, the Academy Trust will participate in the co-ordinated admission arrangements operated by the Local Actionity (LA) and the local Fair Access Protocol.
- Notwibistanding any provision in this Annex, the Secretary of State may:
 - (a) direct the Academy Trust to admit a paged pupil to the St John's and St Peter's Cloff E Academy on application from an LA. This will include

1. INTRODUCTION

Introduction and definitions

- 1,1 This Agraement is between the Secretary of State for Education (the "Secretary of State") and All Saints Multi Academy Trust, Birmingham (the "Academy Trust") and is an academy agreement as defined by section 1 of the Academies Act 2010.
- 1.2 The Acedomy Trust is a company limited by guarantee incorporated in England and Wales with company number 08256653. The Academy Trust is a charity and its circulate are the Charity Trustees of the Academy Trust.
- In order for the Academy Trust to establish and run a number of Academies in England, according to the provisions of the Academies Act 2010, and in order for the Secretary of State to make payments to the Academy Trust, the Academy Trust must meet the requirements in this Agraement and in each Supplemental Agraement that has been entered into by the Academy Trust and the Secretary of State in respect of each Academy.
- 1.4 In this Agreement, and (except as expressly provided otherwise) in each Supplemental Agreement, the capitalised words and expressions listed below will have the following meanings:

Definitions of types of Academies:

An 'Academy' is a achool or educational institution established and run in accordance with the Academias Act 20°0, and where this Agreement refers collectively to 'Academias' run by the Academy Trust, this may include any of the following types of school or educational institution:

A "Free School" means an Academy which is a new aducational institution within the meaning of section 9(1)(a) of the Academies Act 2010.

A 'Mainstreem Academy' hieans an Academy or a Free School which meets the requirements set out in section 1A(1) of the Academics Act 2010.

An 'Alternative Provision Academy' means an Academy of a Free School which moots the requirements set out in section 10(1) of the Academies Act 2010.

A "Special Academy" means an Academy or a Free School which meets the criteria sat out In section 1A(2) of the Academies Act 2010.

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A "Sponsorod Academy" will be (unless otherwise stated) a Mainstream Academy which is established pursuant to an Academy Order under section 4 of the Academies Act 2010, which will be designated as a Sponsored Academy within the Supplemental Agreement applicable to that Academy, and as such certain sensitions may apply to it.

Studio School meens sitype of Fras School, principally for pupils and students aged between 14 and 19, which places an emphasis on such pupils and students obtaining omologability skills through project-based learning.

A '16-19 Academy' means an Academy or a Free School which meats the requirements section (B(1) of the Academies Act 2010.

Other defined terms:

' 16-19 Funding Guidance' means the guidance published by the EFA and emetided from time to time, on behalf of the Socrotary of State.

"Academies Financial Handbook" means the document with that title published by the EFA and amended from time to time, on behalf of the Secretary of State.

'Academy Financial Year' means the year from 1 September to 31 August, or a different period notified in writing by the Secretary of State.

"Articles" means the Academy Trust's articles of association.

"Business day" means any day other than a Saturday, Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday or any day which is a bank holiday with the meaning given to that expression in the Banking and Financial Dealings Act 1871.

"Charley Trustees" means the directors of the Academy Trust who are responsible for the general control and management of the administration of the Academy Trust.

'Chief Inspector' means Har Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills.

Commissioner means take and/or schools reterring pupils to an Atternative Provision Academy for admission under the legal powers set out in the relevant Supplemental Agreement.

"Control" means the power of an organisation of individual ("A") to ensure that the affairs of a analyser organisation are conducted in accordance with A's wishes, whether through share ownership or voting power, by agreement, because of powers conferred by articles of association or any other document, or otherwise; and "Controls" will be construed accordingly.

"DIE" and the expression "Department" means the Department for Education or any successor Department which has responsibility for schools"

"EFA" means the Education Funding Agency.

'Guidance' means guidance issued by or on behalf of the Secretary of State, as amendod from time to time.

' Independent School Standards' meens the independent echool standards prescribed under section 197 of the Education Act 2002.

"LA" means a local authority.

***Local Governing Body**" means the committee (if any) ostablished by the Academy Trust in relation to an Academy or Academios, within the Academy Trust, in accordance with the Articles.

"Parenta" meana parents or guardians.

"Predecessor Solvoot" means the school which the Academy in question replaced, where applicable.

"Publicly Funded Assets" means (a) assets or property funded wholly or partly using payments made by or on behalf of the Secretary of State, and (b) publicly funded land as defined in paragraph 22(3) of Schedula 1 to the Arabentias Act 2010

"Pupil Promium" means an amount equivalent to the pupil gremium as defined in the School and Barly Years Finance (England) Regulations 2019 *Pupil Referral Unit" means any school established in England and maintained by an LA which is specially organised to provide education for chedren falling within section 19(1) of the Education Act 1996.

Any reference to "Secretary of State" includes a reference to the EFA acting on the Secretary of State's behalf.

Secretary of State's consent means the Secretary of State's specific, pror writen consent, which will not be unreasonably withhold of delayed.

SEM moans Special Educational Needs and the expressions *special educational needs* and 'special educational provision* have the meaning set out in sections 20(1) and 21(2) of the Children and Families Act 2014.

"Start-up Period" has the meaning as defined in the relevant Supplemental Agreeനാണ്

'Supplemental Agreement' meens an agreement supplemental to this Agreement for any Academy which the Academy Trust agrees to establish and maintain and the Secretary of State agrees to fund, which is aubstantially in the form of the supplemental funding agreement entered into by both parties at the time that this Agreement is signed.

"Teaching Staff" means teachers and the principal or head teacher employed at the Academy.

'Termination Notice' means a notice sent by the Secretary of State to the Academy Trust, terminating this Agreement and each Supplemental Agreement on the date specified in the notice

- 1.5 The interpretation Act 1978 applies to this Agreement as it applies to an Act of Parlament.
- 1.6 A reference in this Agreement to any party or body includes its successors.
- 1,7 Any words following the terms 'include'. 'including' or 'in particular' are by way of illustration, not limitation.
- 1.8 A reference in this Agreement to land includes any pulldlugs or structures on the land.
- 1.9 A reference in this Agreement to publis includes students at a 16-15 Academy.

- 1.10 Where any legislation, legal requirement or published guidance is referred to, unless otherwise stated, the following terms should be interpreted as follows
 - a) "school" refers to the relevant Mainstream Academy, Altamative Provision Academy, Special Academy or Studio School, and "educational institution" refers, where the context so admittal to a 16-19 Academy:
 - b) the "head teacher" may refer to the Academy's head teacher or principal;
 - references to the "governing body" or "responsible authorities" will be taken to refer to line Acodemy Trust; and
 - references to registered pupils will be treated as references to registered pupils at the Academy
- 1.11 References in this Agreement or any Supplemental Agreement to any named legislation, legal requirement or published guidence should be taken to include आy amendment to or replacement of it.
- 1.12 If any questions arise about how this Agreement should be interpreted, the answer will be decided by the Secretary of State, after discussion with the Academy Trust

General Obligations of the Academy Youst

- 1.13 In order for the Adademy Trust to establish and run independent achools and/or educational institutions in England, according to two terms of the Adademies Addition, and in order for the Secretary of State to make payments to the Adademy Trust, the Adademy Trust must meet the conditions and requirements set out in this Agreement, and in each Supplemental Agreement for an Adademy for which payments are claimed. In particular, the Adademy Trust must ensure the Adademies it runs meet the applicable requirements as follows:
 - a) for **Mainstream Academies**, those specified in Section 1A of the Academies Act 2010;

Disabled pupils in this paragraph mean pupils who are disabled for the purposes of the Equality Act 2010.
- 1,14 To the extent that it is compatible with the Academy Trust fulfilling its charitable outpose of advancing education in the United Kingdom for the public banefit the Academy Trust must ensure that each of its Academies is at the heart of its community, promoting examinating consoler and sharing facilities with other schools and/or other educational institutions and the wider community.
- I 16 The Academy Trust must conduct its Academias within the terms and requirements of:

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- a) the Articles;
- b) sny legislation or legal requirement that applies to academies, including the Independent School Standards and legislation about meeting the needs of pupils with SEN and disabilities;

- 1,19 The Adademy Trust is not required to publish information under this Agreement, or any Supplemental Agreement, if to do so would breach its obligations under the Data Protection Act 1995.
- 1.20 The Academy Trust must ensure that its Academics most the needs of incividual pupils, including pupils with SEN and disabilities.

Governance

- 1.21 The Academy Trust will be governed by a board comprising the Charity Trustees of the Academy Trust (the 'Board of Charity Trustees').
- 1.22 The Board of Charity Trustees must have regard to any Goldance on the governmence of academy trusts.
- 1.23 The Adademy Youst must onsure that it engages with the rolevent Local Governing Body (if any) or representatives of each Adademy, and that arrangements are in

- 1.24 The Academy Trust must provide to the Scoretary of State the names of all new or replacement members of the Acedemy Trust, stating the date of their appointment and, where applicable, the name of the member they replaced as soon as is practicable and in any event within 34 days of their appointment.
- 1.25 The Academy Trust must not appoint any new or replacement members will it has first informed them, and they have agreed, that their names will be shared with the Secretary of Stata to enable him to assess their suitability.
- 1.26 If the Academy Trust establishes and maintains a Free School, it must in addition to the obligations under clauses 1.24 and 1.25.
 - a) provide to the Secretary of State the names of all new or replacement Charity Trustees of the Academy Trust, stating whether they have been appointed or elected, the date of their appointment or election and, where applicable, the name of the Charity Trustees they replaced as soon as is practicable and in any event within 14 days of their appointment or election; and
 - b) not appoint or elect any new or replacement Charity Trustees until it has first informed them, and they have agreed, that their names will be shared with the Secretary of State to enable him to assess their suitability.
- 1,27 The Academy Trust must not amend or remove the provisions in its Articles relating to the appointment or election or the resignation or removal of Charity Trustees or members ("the Governance Articles") without the Secretary of State's consent.
- 1.28 Defore any change to the Governance Articles is proposed the Academy finishmust give police to the Secretary of State of:
 - a) the proposed amendment or removal; and;
 - b) the reason for it.
- 1.29 If the Secretary of State consents to the proposed changes, the Adademy Trust shall approve any changes to the Articles as soon as reasonably practicable and provide the Secretary of State with a copy of the americal Articles and the resolution(s) approving them.

2. RUNNING OF THE ACADEMIES

Length of school day and year

2.1 The length of the achool day and year will be the responsibility of the Academy Trust and for the purpose of this paragraph "school" also means a 16 to 19 Academy.

Teachers and staff

- 2.2 In complying with the Independent School Standards, the Academy Trust must require enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (*DBS*) certificates as appropriate for members of staff, supply staff, members of the Academy Trust, Individual Charty Trustees and the chair of the Board of Charty Trustees.
- 2.3 The Academy Trust must promptly submit to the Secretary of State, on request, the Information contained in any enhanced DBS certificate that it receives.
- 2.4 The Academy Trust must, where applicable, in respect of each of its Academies designate a member of staff at each Academy responsible for promoting the educational achievement of pupils at the Academy who are iteling looked after by an LA, and in coing so must comply with the law, regulations and guidance that apply to maintained schools.
- 2.5 Teachers' pay and conditions of sorvice at the Academies are the responsibility of the Academy Trust.
- 2.6 The Academy Trust must chause that all reachers amployed in each Academy have access to the Teachers' Pension Scheme and, in so doing, must comply with the requirements of the scheme and With Pair (Dea) for staff pensions guidence published by HM Treasury.
- 2,7 The Academy Trust must, in accordance with the Local Government Pension Scheme (Administration) Regulations 2008 and with For Deal for staff pensions guidance published by HM Tressury, ensure that all offected staff employed by the Academy Trust other than teachers have access to the Local Government Pension Scheme, unless an individual expressly chooses to optical of the Scheme in accordance with the regulations.
- 2.8 Where a member of the Teaching Staff employed at an Academy applies for a feasining post at another academy, a maintained action of a further education

institution, the Academy Trust must at the request of the board of governors or academy trust of that other educational institution:

- a) Boviso in wilting whether or not, in the provious two years, there has been any formal capability considerations of proceedings for that teacher at the Academy or the Predecessor School;
- give written details of the concerns which gave rise to any such consideration
 of that teacher's capability, the dwallon of the proceedings and their outcome.

School meals

- 2.9 Subject to clause 2.12, the Academy Trust must provide achool lunches and free school lunches in accordance with the provisions of sections 512(3) and 512ZB(1) of the Education Act 1998 as if references in sections 512 and 512ZB to a local authority were to the Academy Trust and as if references to a school maintained by a local authority were to any of its Academies.
- 2,10 The Academy Trust must comply with school food standards legislation as if its Academies were maintained achoals.
- 2.11 Where the Academy Trust provides milk to pupils, it must be provided free of charge to pupils who would be eligible for free milk if they were pupils at a methicalned achool.
- 2.12 Clauses 2.910 2.11 do not apply to 16-19 Academies. For 16-19 Academies, the Academy Trust must comply with any Guidance in relation to free meals in the further education sector, as far as it applies to those Academies.

Pupii Premium

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- 2.13 For all of its Academies eligible for Pupil Premium, and for each Financial Year, the Academy Trust must publish, on the Academy's websile, Information about:
 - ine amount of Pupil Promising allocation that I will receive during the Academy Financial Year;
 - b) what it Intends to spend the Pupil Premium afforation on;
 - what it spent its Pupil Premium ellocation on in the previous Academy Financial Year;

- the impact of the previous year's Pupil Premium allocation on aducational sitalnment.
- 2.14 For all of its Academies eligible for Year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up gremium funding, and for each Academy Financial Year, the Academy Trust must publish, on the Academy's wabsite, information about:
 - e) the amount of Year 7 literacy and numeracy carch-up premium grant that it will receive during the Academy Financial Year;
 - b) what it intends to spend to Year 7 literacy and remersely catch-up premium grantion;
 - c) what it apent its Year 7 (tersey and numeracy জেঞ্চে-up premium gram on in the previous Academy সাnancial Year:
 - d) the impact of the previous year's Year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium grent on educational attainment, and from that affect was assessed.

Charging

- 2.15 For all its Academies except 16 to 19 Academies, the Academy Trust must comply with socilons 402, 450-457 and 459-462 of the Education Act 1996 with regard to public examinations, charging, providing information, inviling valuntary contributions and recovering civil cebts, as if its Academies were maintained schools.
- 2.18 There must be no charge for edmission to or attendance at any of the Academies, and the Academies will only charge pupils where the law allows maintained schools to charge.
- 2.17 Clause 2.15 goes not provent the Academy Trust receiving funds from an LA or a charity in respect of the admission and attendence of a pupil with SBN to an Academy.
- 2.18 Notwithstanding clause 2.16, the Academy Trust may charge people who are not registered pupils at one of its Academies for education of use of facilities.
- 2.19 Where an Academy provides a public with board and todging, the Academy Trust must not charge the parent of that pupil more than the cost to the Academy Trust of providing the board and lodging, except as required by the Fees, Charges and Levies guidance in HM Treasury's publication 'Managing Public Money'.

Exclusione

- 2.20 In respect of Mainstream Academics, and Special Academies which admit publis without statements of SEN and Studio Schools, the Academy Trust must, if asked to by an LA, enter into an agreement which has the effect that where:
 - a) the Academy admits a pupil who has been dermanently excluded from a maintelned achool, the Academy itself or another academy with whom the LA has a similar agreement; or
 - b) the Academy Trust permanently excludes a pupil from the Academy.

the arrangements for payment will be the same as if the Academy were a maintained school, under Regulations made under section 47 of the Schools Standards and Framework Act 1996.

Curriculum

- 2.21 The curriculum is the responsibility of the Academy Trust.
- 2.22 The Academy Trust must ensure that the curriquium provided in each Academy to pupils up to the age of 16 is balanced and broadly based. In respect of Makhatheam and Special Academies, the Academy Trust must ensure that the curriculum includes English, mathematics and science. In respect of Alternative Provision Academies the Academy Trust must ensure that the curriculum includes English and mathematics.
- 2.23 The Academy Trust must publish information in relation to the current curriculum provision at each Academy on that Academy's websits, including.
 - a) the contant of the curriculum;
 - its approach to the curricult(η);
 - If applicable the GCSE options and other Key Stage 4 qualifications offered by each Academy and, if applicable, any other qualifications offered by each. Academy.
 - d) the names of early phonics or reading schemes in operation for Key Stage 1.4 applicable: and

- how parents (including parents of prospective pupils) and Commissioners (if applicable) can obtain further information about that Academy's configuration.
- 2.24 The Academy Trust must not allow any view or theory to be faught as cyldence-based if it is contrary to established scientific or historical evidence and explanations. This clause applies to all subjects taught at an Academy.
- 2.25 The Academy Trust must provide for the feaching of evolution as a compromensive, coherent and extensively evidenced theory. In respect of any **Alternative Provision Academies and 18-19 Academies**, the Academy Trust must do this whore relevant to the curriculum.
- 2.26 The Academy Trust must ensure the Academy actively promotes the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.
- 2.26A The Academy Trust must ensure the Academy promotes principles that suppose equality of appointunity for all.
- 2.27 The Academy Trust must ensure that careers guidance is provided at each of its Academies, in accordance with the requirements on maintained schools in the Education Act 1997.

Assessment

- 2.28 The Academy Trust must:
 - a) ensure that pupils and students at each of its Academies are entered for examinations, in line with the requirements on marmained achools in section 402 of the Education Act 1996;
 - b) comply with the rolevant Guidence, as it applies to maintained schools, in respect of each **Mainstream Academy**, each **Special Academy** and each **Studio School** to ensure that pupils take part in assessments, and in leacher assessments of pupils' performance; and must do so for each **Alternative**Provision Academy upless there are exceptional reasons to colorherwise;
 - c) ensure (not aludents at each **16 to 19 Academy** lake part in assessments ং students' performance appropriate to the qualifications offered;

- d) report of: assessments as the Secrolary of State requires, or provide any information on agaeesments, on the same basis that maintained achools are required to provide the information;
- for all Key Stages, allow monitoring and necderation of the Academy's
 opposite an arrangement as required by the Secretary of State
- 2.29 Unless specifically approved in writing by the Secretary of State the Academy Trust must not use GAG to offer any course of education or training which loads to a qualification, if that qualification is not approved by the Secretary of State for the purpose of section 96 of the Learning and Skills Act 2000.
- 2.30 Unloss informed by the Secretary of State that alternative Information must be published, the Academy Trust must ensure that the following information is published on the relevant Academy's website for each Mainstream Academy, for each Alternative Provision Academy, and where relevant for each Special Academy, and it respect of sub-paragraph b) where relevant for each Studio School:
 - if applicable, the Academy's most recent Key Stage 2 results as published by the Secretary of State in the School Performance Tables;
 - 1. "% adhleving Level 4 or above in reading, writing and metrs":

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- III. 1% of pupils making expected progress":
- Information about where and how parents (Induding parents of prospective pupils) can access the most recont report about the Academy published by the Chief Inspector; and
- d) information as to where and how parants (including parents of prospective pupils) can access the School Performance Tables published by the Secretary of State.
- 2.31 The Academy Trust trust ensure that, in relation to any **15.18 Academies**, any performance information requested by the Sacretary of State is published on the Academy's website.
- 2.32 The Secretary of State may (firect any Academy to participate in international education surveys, under the Education Act 1996, as if it were a maintained achool.

3. GRANT FUNDING

Recurrent Expenditure Grants

- 3.1 The Secretary of State will pay gravis towards Recurrent Expenditure, and may pay gravis towards Capital Expanditure, for each Academy.
- 3.2 "Requirent Expanditure" hreans any money spect on the establishment, condust, administration and maintenance of an Academy which does not fall within Capital Expanditure.
- 3.3 In respect of Recurrent Expenditure, the Secretary of State will pay **General Annual Grant ("GAG")** and may additionally pay **Earmarked Annual Grant ("EAG")** These are two separate and distinct grants.
- 3.4 Except with the Secretary of State's consent, the Academy Trust must not make commitments to spending words will have substantial implications for future grant. No decision by the Academy Trust will commit the Secretary of State to paying any particular amount of grant.

Capital Grant

3.5 The Socretary of State may pay a grant ("Capital Grant") to the Academy Trust for the purpose of spending on Items of Capital Expenditure.

3.6 'Capital Expenditure' means expanditure on:

- a) accuiring and and buildings;
- b) eracting, enlarging, engrowing or demolishing any building including fixed plant, installation, wall, fence or other structure, or any playground or hard standing;
- c) estalling electrical, mechanical or other services other than necessary (epairs and maintenance due to normal wear and teer;
- d) buying vehicles:
- installing and equipping premises with furnishings and equipment other than
 necessary (opairs and maintanence due to normal weer and lear.
- f) Installing and equipping premises with computers, networking for computers, operating software and ICT equipment, other than necessary updates or repairs and maintenance due to normal wear and tear;
- g) providing and equipping premises, including playing fields and other facilities for social activities and physical recreation other than necessary repairs and maintenance due to normal wear, and tear;
- h) works of a permanent character other than the purchase or replacement of minor day-to-day items.
- any major repairs of replacements which are specified as capital excenditure in any grant latter relating to them;
- j) such other items (whother like or unlike any of the foregoing) of a substantial or enduring nature which the Secretary of State agrees are capital expenditure for the purposes of this Agreement:
- k) professional fees properly and reasonably incurred in connection with the provision of any of the above;
- VAT and other taxes payable on any of the above.
- 3.7 Any Capital Grant funding that may be made available to the Acedemy Trust will be notified to it by the Secretary of State.

- 3.8 The Academy Trust must spend Capital Grant only on Itams of Capital Expenditure approved by the Secretary of State and in accordance with conditions specified by the Secretary of State. Further, the Academy Trust must provide evidence that it has obtained all pranning and other consents required for any proposed building and infrastructure development to be funded using Capital Grant.
- 3.9 In order to receive payments of Capital Grant, the Academy Trust must provide supporting invoices and certificates in the format specified by the Secretary of State.
- 3.10 The Academy Trust must provide an account of Capital Grant roceived and associated aparting on Capital Expenditure using Capital Grant in the Academy Trust's financial statements and any financial reports or returns that the Secretary of State may require.
- If in its use of Capital Grant the Academy Trust does not comply with this Agreement or any of the conditions specified by the Secretary of State, or the project does not accord with the original specification or has not been completed, the Secretary of State may at his discretion not make any further payments of Capital Grant and require the Academy Trust to repay all or part of the Capital Grant.

General Annual Grant (GAG)

- 3.12 The Secretary of State will pay GAG to the Academy Trust towards the normal running costs or capital expanditure of each of its Academies, including:
 - a) teachers' satanea and related costs (including pension contributions, full and part-time teaching staff and payments in respect of seconded teachers);
 - b) non-teaching staff selecies and related costs (including pension contributions):
 - c) employees' expenses;
 - d) boying, maintaining, copairing and replacing teaching and learning materials and other educational equipment, including books and stationary:
 - e) buying, matmatning, repairing and replacing other assets including 'CT' equipment and software, sports equipment and laboratory equipment and materials,
 - /) sxamination feet;

- g) repairs, servicing and maintonance of buildings (including redectration, heating, plumbing, lighting etc.); maintenance of grounds (including boundary fences and walls); insurance; closning materials and contract dearing; water and sewerage; fuel and light (including electricity and gas); rents, rates; purchase, maintenance, repairs and replacement of furniture and littings;
- medical equipment and supplies;
- η staff development (including ---service training);
- j) carriculum development;
- the costs of providing school meats for pupils (Including the cost of providing free school functions to pupils who are digital to receive them), and any discretionary grants to pupils to meet the cost of pupil support, including support for pupils with SEN or disabilities;
- # administration; and
- m) establishment expenses and other institutional costs.
- 3,13 GAG for each Academy Financial Year for each Mainstream Academy, Special Academy and Studio School will melude:
 - a) funding equivalent to that which would be received by a maintained school
 with similar characteristics, determined by the Secretary of State and taking
 account of the number of pupils at the Academy;
 - b) funding to cover nacessary functions which would be carried out by the relevant LA If the Academy were a maintained school;
 - c) payment of any additionet specific grants made evailable to maintained achoo's, where the Academy mosts the criteria for those grants, and at the Secretary of State's discretion; and
 - a) Funding for any other tosts to the Academy which the Secretary of State considers necessary.
- 3.14 The Academy Trust tuse GAG only for maintaining, carrying on, managing and developing the Academies in accordance with this Agreement and the relevant

Supplemental Agreement, except where the Secretary of State has given specific consent for the Academy Trust to use GAG for enother charitable purpose.

- 3 (6) In particular (but will/out timitation) the Academy Trust most not use GAG for:
 - a) equication and training for adults who are not pupils of the Academy, other than staff professional development;
 - b) nursery provision for which parents are charged a fee;
 - c) nursery provision to chiloron outside of the relevant Academy's age range as stated in the applicable Supplemental Agreement;
 - d) Children's Centres:
 - e) any additional cost of providing sourt and leisure feddilles for a purpose not permitted in clause 3,14.

Eagrarked Annual Grant (EAG)

- 3.18 The Secretary of State may pay EAG to the Academy Trust for specific purposes agreed between the Secretary of State and the Academy Trust, and as described in the relevant funding setter. The Academy Trust must spend EAG only in accordance with that letter.
- 3.17 Where the Academy Trust is seeking a specific EAG for any Academy Financial Year, 3 must send a lotter cultining its proposate and the reasons for the request to the Cité.

Arrangements for paying GAG and EAG

- 3 18 Before each Academy Financial Year, the Secretary of State with notify the Academy Trust of the GAG and EAG amounts in respect of each Academy Which, subject to parliamentary approval, the Secretary of State place for that Academy Financial Year and now these have been calculated.
- 3.19 The amounts of GAG for an Academy Financial Year will be catermined annually by the Secretary of State, and notified to the Academy Trust in a funding letter semble force the relevant Academy Financial Year bagins (the "Annual Letter of Funding").

- 3.20 Amounts of EAG will be notified to the Academy Trust whorever possible in the Annual Letter of Funding or as soon as is practicable afterwards.
- 3.21 The Annual Letter of Funding will, as Well as stating the grant amounts, set out now these have been calculated. It will not include grants which cannot be calculated in time because there is not enough information, or for other administrative reasons.

 Any such grants will be notified as soon as practicable.
- 3.22 The Secretary of State will pay GAG in monthly instalments on or before first day of cattin (north ("the relevant month"), to fund the salaries and other payroti costs of all monthly paid employees and all other costs payable during the relevant month. The dutalled arrangements for payment will be set out in the Annual Letter of Funcing, or an equivalent.

3.23 If GAG or EAG is miscalculated:

- a) because of a mistake by the Secretary of State, which leads to an underpayment to the Academy Trust, the Secretary of State will correct the underpayment in the same or subsequent Academy Financial Years;
- b) hexause the Academy Trust provided incorrect information, which leads to an underpayment to the Academy Trust, the Secretary of State may correct the underpayment in the same or subsequent Academy Financial Years;
- c) for any reason which results in an overpayment to the Academy Trust, the Secretary of State may recover any overpart grant in the same or subsequent Academy Financia: Years, having considered all the relevant circumstances and taking into account any representations from the Academy Trust.

Other relevant funding

3.24. The Academy Trust may receive additional funding from an I.A under an agreement with that LA for the provision of support for pupils with SEN who require high levels of such support. The Academy Trust must ensure that all support required under that agreement is provided for those pupils.

4. FINANCIAL AND ACCOUNTING REQUIREMENTS

Genoral

- 4.1 In order for the Secretary of State to provide grant funcing to the Academy Trust, the Academy Trust must be fulfilling the financial and reporting requirements in this Agreement, and any Supplemental Agreements.
- 4.2. In its conduct and operation, the Adademy Trust must apply financial and other controls which meet the requirements of regularity, propriety and value for money.
- 4.3 The Academy Trust must appoint an accounting officer and must notify the Secretary of State of that appointment. The Academy Trust must assign to the accounting officer the responsibilities of the role set out in the Academies Financial Handbook and HM Treasury's publication 'Managing Public Money'.
- The Academy Trust most abide by the requirements of, and have regard to the guidance for, charities and charity trustees is sued by the Charity Commission and, in particular, the Charity Commission's guidance on 'Protecting Charities from Harm'.

 Any references in this document which require charity trustees to report to the Charity Commission should instead be interpreted as reporting to the body or person appointed as the principal regulator under the Charities Act 2011.
- 4.5 The Academy Trust most shide by the requirements of the current 18 to 19 Sunding Guidance published by the Secretary of State. In respect of any provision for students who are above compulsory school age until the academic year in which they reach the age of 19.
- 4.5A If the Secretary of State pays any grent to or on behalf of the Academy Trust, in respect of any Free Schools that the Academy Trust establishes and maintains, which includes an amount to cover VAT, the Academy Trust shall, having paid the VAT, promptly submit a VAT rectain adplication to Hor Majesty's Revenue and Customs (HMRC). Any failure by the Academy Trust to submit a VAT rectain application to HMRC, or to pursue the application diligently, or to repay any reclaim amount to the Secretary of State as soon as reasonably practicable following receipt will be taxen into account by the Secretary of State in:
 - aj calculating and paying any subsequent grant to the Academy Trust; or

 adjusting GAG payable to the Academy Trust in subsequent Academy Sinancial Years.

Application of the Academiles Financial Handbook

- 4.6 In relation to the use of grant paid to the Academy Trust by the Secretary of State.
 the Academy Trust must follow the requirements of, and have regard to the guidance in the Academies Financial Handbook.
- 4.7 The Academy Trust must have adequate insurance cover or opt in to the Department's arrangements as set out in the Academies Financial Handbook.
- 4.8 The Academy Trial most submit information about its finances to the Secretary of State in accordance with the Academies Financial Handbook, or as otherwise specified by the Secretary of State.

Budgeling for funds

- 4.9 The Academy Trust must balance its budget from each Academy Financial Year to the next. For the avoidance of doubt, this does not prevent the Academy Trust from:
 - a) subject to clause 4.14, carrying a surplus from one Academy Financial Year to the next, of
 - b) serrying forward from previous Academy Financial Years sufficient cumulative surpluses on grants from the Secretary of State to meet an in-year deficit on such grants in a subsequent (inancial year, in accordance with clauses 4.14-4.16 and 3.L of the relevant Supplemental Agreement; or
 - c) incurring an in-year deficition funds from sources other than grants from the Secretary of State in any Academy Finances Year, provided a specific affect the Academy Trust's responsibility to ensure that its Academies palance their respective overall budgets from each Academy Financial Year to the next.
- 4.10 The Academy Trust may spend or accumulate funds from private sources or public accross other than grants from the Secretary of State for the benefit of the Academy Trust as it sees for Any surplus from private or public sources other than grants from the Secretary of State must be separately identified in the Academy Trust's accounts.
- 4.11 For darity, and in accordance with the Intent of parity of funding with LA maintained schools, in dictionistances where a Predecessor School had a deficit balance and the

- DIE has settled this with the relevant EA, that amount will be recovered from the Academy Trust's GAG over a period not normally exceeding 3 years (unless the Secretary of State's in his discretion decides otherwise) after the Academy opened.
- 4.12 The Academy Trust's budget must be approved for each Academy Financial Year by the Board of Charity Trustess.
- 4.13 The approved budget must be submitted to the Secretary of State in a form, and by a date, to be notified by the Secretary of State.

Carrying forward of funds

- 4.14 At the end of any Academy Financial Year the Academy Trust may carry forward unapent GAG from previous Academy Financial Years without funit (unless a limit is specified in the Academiles Financial Handbook, or otherwise as specified in writing by the Secretary of State, in which case that limit will apply).
- 4.15 The Academy Trust must use any GAG carried forward only for purposes of GAG as set out in this agreement, or otherwise as specified in the Academies Financial Handbook or in writing by the Secretary of State.
- 4.16 Any additional grant provided for an Academy's Start-Up Period may be varried forward, without limitation or deduction, until the Start-Up Period ends.
- 4.17 Any unspent grant not allowed to be carried forward under diabases 4.14-4.16 and 3.L of the relevant Supplemental Agreement may be taken into account in the payment of subsequent grant.

Annual accounts and audit

- 4.18 The Academy Trust must prepare and file with Companies House the annual reports and accounts required by the Companies Act 2008.
- 4.19 kg addition, the Academy Trust must prepare its annual reports and accounts for each Academy Financial Year.
 - a) in eccordance with the Charity Cornnysswor's 'Accounting and Reporting by Charittes: Statement of Recommended Practice', as if the Academy Trust was a registered charity; and
 - b) officialise as the Secretary of State directs.

- 4,20 The Academy Trust's accounts must be sudited annually by Independent auditors appointed in line with the Academies Financial Hamiltock.
- 4.23 The accounts must carry an audit report stating whether, in the opinion of the auditors the accounts show a true and fair view of the Academy Trust's affairs. The accounts must also be supported by such other audit reports, relating to the use of grants and other matters, as the Secretary of State directs.
- 4.22 The Academy Trust's across report must include the names of all members of the Academy Trust who served during the year.
- 4.23 The Academy Trust's annual reports and accounts, and the auditor's reports, must be submitted to the Secretary of State by 31 December each Academy Financial Year, or as otherwise specified by the Secretary of State. The Academy Trust must publish on its website its engulal reports and accounts, current momorandum of association, Articles and Funding Agreement and the names of its Charity Trustees and members. The Secretary of State may also publish the Academy Trust's annual reports and accounts, and the audit report, as he sees fit

Keeping Enancial records

4.24 The Academy Trust most keep proper accounting records. Statements of insome and expenditure, statements of cash flow and balance sheets must be produced in such form and frequency as the Secretary of State directs.

Access to fluancial records

- 4.25 The books of accounts and all relevant rocords, files and toports of the Academy Trust, including those relating to Phancial controls, must be examist, reasonable times to officials of the Difficand the National Audit Office, and to their eigents and contractors, for inspection or carrying out value for money studies. The Academy Trust must give those officials and contractors reasonable assistance with their originities. For the purposes of this clause 'relevant' means in any way relevant to the provision and use of grants provided by the Secretary of State when this Agreement.
- 4.26 The Secretary of State may, at his expense, instruct awaters to report to him on the adequacy and effectiveness of the Academy Trust's accounting systems and internal controls to standards determined by the Secretary of State, and to make recommendations for improving the Academy Trust's financial management.

Acquiring and disposing of Publicly Funded Assets

- 4.27 In relation to Publicly Funded Assets, the Academy Trust must not, without the Secretary of State's consent;
 - a) acquire or dispose of freehold land;
 - b) take up or grent a lossahold of land;

dispose of any other class of capital assets except as permitted in the Academies. Financial Handbook, and subject to Part 3 of Schedule 1 to the Academies Act 2010.

Retention of proceeds from the disposal of capital assets.

- 4.29 Except as permitted in the Academies Financial Handbock, if the Academy Trust soils depite: assets which were acquired or enhanced wholly or partly using payments made by or on behalf of HM Government the Academy Trust must pay to the Secrotary of State, at his requiest, an emount of the sale proceeds equivalent to the proportion of the original cost of the acquisition or enhancement which was met by or on behalf of HM Government.
- 4.30 If the Adadomy Trust sells a capital asset which was transferred to it for no or nonival consideration from an LA, a Predecessor School or a Predecessor School's foundation, the Adadomy Trust must, if required by the Secretary of State, pay sillor part of the sale proceeds to the LA or to the Secretary of State, taking into account the emount of the proceeds to be reinvested by the Adademy Trust.

Transactions outside the usual planned range

- 4.31 In relation to Publicity Funded Assets, the Academy Trust must not, without the Secretary of State's consent:

offer to make any special payments as defined in HM Treasury's publication.

Menaging Public Money' (including ox gratia payments, staff severence payments and compensation payments).

above any values specified in the Academies Financial Handbook.

- 4.32 The Academy Trust must give the Secretary of State 30 days' notice, whether or not the discumstances require his consent, of its Intention to do any of the actions in clause 4.31.
- 4.33 The Acedemy Trust must promptly notify the Secretary of State of any loss arising from suspected theft or fraud in line with the requirements in the Acedemiles Financial Handbook, or otherwise specified by the Secretary of State.

Borrowing

4.34 Except as permitted in the Academies Financial Handbook, the Academy Trust must not corrow against Publicly Funded Assets, or so as to put Publicly Funded Assets at risk, Without the Secretary of State's consent.

5. <u>COMPLAINTS</u>

- 2.AA The Academy Trust must prevent political indoctrination, and secure the balanced treatment of political lesues, in line with the requirements for maintained schools set out in the Education Act 1996, and have regard to any Guidance.

5.R The Secretary of State will, before the start of each Academy Financial Year, provide the Academy Trust with a final funding allocation Indicating the level of GAG and EAG to be provided in the next Academy Financial Year (the "Funding Allocation").

- 5.8 If the Academy Trust is of the opinion that, after receipt of the l'unding Allocation for the next Academy Financial Year (the "Critical Year") and after taking into account all other resources likely to be available to the Academy, including other funds that are likely to be available to the Academy from other academies operated by the Academy Trust ("All Other Resources"), it is likely that the cost of running the Academy during the Critical Year would cause the Academy Trust to become insolvent (and for this reason only) then the Academy Trust may give written notice of its intention to terminate this Agreement at the end of the Critical Year.

- 5.X The Expert will be required in reaching his determination to take account of educe from an educational specialist who is professionally familiar with the issues arising from the budget management of actuals. If the parties fail to egree upon the appointment of the advestional specialist then the educational specialist will be appointed by the Chainman of the Specialist Schools and Academies Trust (or any successor or equivalent body). The educational specialist's fees will be borno equally between the parties.
- 6.Y If the Expert determines that the cost of running the Academy during the Critical Year would cause the Academy Trust to become insolvent, and the Secretary of State will not have agreed to provide sufficient additional funding to cover the Shortfall, then the Academy Trust will be entitled to terminate this Agreement, by potice explains on 31 August of the Critical Year. ***Statement of SEN"** means a statement made undersaction 324 of the Education. Act 1996.

"EHC plan" means an Education, Health and Care plan made under sections 37(2) of the Children and Families Act 2014.

- A Except as set out in clause 8 below, the Children and Families Act 2014 imposes duties directly on Academies in respect of pupils with special educational needs, including the admission of pupils with EHC plans. If an Academy Trust considers that a LA should not have named the Academy in an EHC plan, it may ask the Secretary of State to determine whether the LA has acted unreasonably, and to make an order directing the LA to reconsider. The Secretary of State's determination will be final, subject to any right of appeal which a parent of the child may have to the First Tier Tribunal (Special Educational Needs and Disability) or the Upper Tribunal Administrative Appeals Chamber.

8. ADMISSION OF PUPILS WITH SEN AND DISABILITIES

- 8.A The Academy Trust must for each of its Academies, subject to its right of appeal to the Secretary of State, admit all pupils with a statement of SEN noming the Academy.
- 8.8 Where an LA proposes to name one of the Academies in a statement of SEN, it must give the Academy Trust written notice of this, stating why it considers that Academy to be suitable for the pupil in question. Within 15 days of receipt of the LA's notice, the Academy Trust must consent to being named, except

where admitting the child would be incompatible with the provision of efficient aducation for other children, and no reasonable steps could secure compatibility. In deciding whether a child's inclusion would be incompatible with the efficient education of other children or the efficient use of resources, the Academy Trust must have regard to the relevant Guidance Issued to maintained schools.

- 8.C If the Academy Trust decides that admitting the child would be incompatible with the provision of efficient education or the efficient use of resources, it must, within the 15 days, notify the LA in writing, giving its reasons for its decision.
- 8.D The Academy Trust must then seek to establish from the LA whether or not it agrees with this determination. If the IA does not agree with the Academy Trust's response, and names the Academy In the child's statement of SEN, the Academy Trust must admit the child to the school as specified in the statement or otherwise by the LA.
- 8.E If In such case, the Academy Trust considers that the LA should not have named the Academy in the statement, it may ask the Secretary of State to determine whether the LA has acted unreasonably, and to make an order directing the LA to reconsider. The Secretary of State's determination will be final, subject only to any right of appeal which a parent of the child may have to the First-tier Tribunal (Special Educational Needs and Disability) or the Upper Tribunal Administrative Appeals Chamber.
- B.F. If a parent of a child for whom the I.A maintains a statement appoals to the First-tier Tribunal (Special Educational Needs and Disability), either for or against the naming of the Academy in the child's statement, then the Tribunate decision will be binding, even if it is different from that of the Socretary of State.
- 8.G Where it has been finally determined that the Academy be named in a child's statement of SEN, the Academy Trust must somit the child to the Academy, notwithstanding any other admissions requirements in this Agreement.

8.H Clauses 8.A to 8.G only apply insofar as the relevant provisions of the Children and Families Act 2014 relating to SEN and disability do not apply to Academies and Free Schools.

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1. INTRODUCTION

Introduction and definitions

- 1.1 This Agreement is between the Secretary of State for Education (the "Secretary of State") and All Saints Multi Academy Trust (the "Academy Trust") and is an academy agreement as defined by section 1 of the Academies Act 2010.
- 1.2 The Academy Trust is a company limited by guarantee incorporated in England and Wales with company number 08255653. The Academy Trust is a charity and its directors are the Charity Trustees of the Academy Trust.
- In order for the Academy Trust to establish and run a number of Academies in England, according to the provisions of the Academies Act 2010, and in order for the Secretary of State to make payments to the Academy Trust, the Academy Trust must meet the requirements in this Agreement and in each Supplemental Agreement that has been entered into by the Academy Trust and the Secretary of State in respect of each Academy.
- 1.4 In this Agreement, and (except as expressly provided otherwise) in each Supplemental Agreement, the capitalised words and expressions listed below will have the following meanings:-

Definitions of types of Academies:

An "Academy" is a school or educational institution established and run in accordance with the Academies Act 2010, and where this Agreement refers collectively to "Academies" run by the Academy Trust, this may include any of the following types of school or educational institution:

A "Free School" means an Academy which is a new educational institution within the meaning of section 9(1)(a) of the Academies Act 2010;

A "Mainstream Academy" means an Academy or a Free School which meets the requirements set out in section 1A(1) of the Academies Act 2010;

An "Alternative Provision Academy" means an Academy or a Free School which meets the requirements set out in section 1C(1) of the Academies Act 2010;

A "Special Academy" means an Academy or a Free School which meets the criteria set out in section 1A(2) of the Academies Act 2010;

A "Sponsored Academy" will be (unless otherwise stated) a Mainstream Academy which is established pursuant to an Academy Order under section 4 of the Academies Act 2010, which will be designated as a Sponsored Academy within the Supplemental Agreement applicable to that Academy, and as such certain conditions may apply to it;

"Studio School" means a type of Mainstream Academy, principally for pupils and students aged between 14 and 19, which places an emphasis on such pupils and students obtaining employability skills through project-based learning;

"University Technical College" means a type of Free School, principally for pupils and students aged between 14 and 19, which provides technical education with the emphasis on a particular industry or scientific sector;

A "16-19 Academy" means an Academy or a Free School which meets the requirements set out in section 1B(1) of the Academies Act 2010.

Other defined terms:

"16-19 Funding Guidance" means the guidance published by the ESFA and amended from time to time, on behalf of the Secretary of State.

"Academies Financial Handbook" means the document with that title published by the ESFA and amended from time to time, on behalf of the Secretary of State.

"Academy Financial Year" means the year from 1 September to 31 August, or a different period notified in writing by the Secretary of State.

"Articles" means the Academy Trust's articles of association.

"Business Day" means any day other than a Saturday, Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday or any day which is a bank holiday with the meaning given to that expression in the Banking and Financial Dealings Act 1971.

"Charity Trustees" means the directors of the Academy Trust who are responsible for the general control and management of the administration of the Academy Trust.

Chief Inspector means Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills.

"Commissioner" means LAs and/or schools referring pupils to an Alternative Provision Academy for admission under the legal powers set out in the relevant Supplemental Agreement.

"Control" means the power of an organisation or individual ("A") to ensure that the affairs of another organisation are conducted in accordance with A's wishes, whether through share ownership or voting power, by agreement, because of powers conferred by articles of association or any other document, or otherwise; and "Controls" will be construed accordingly.

"EHC Plan" means an education, health and care plan made under section 37 of the Children and Families Act 2014.

"ESFA" means the Education and Skills Funding Agency.

"Guidance" means guidance issued by or on behalf of the Secretary of State, as amended from time to time.

"Independent School Standards" means the independent school standards prescribed under section 157 of the Education Act 2002.

"LA" means a local authority.

"Local Governing Body" means the committee (if any) established by the Academy Trust in relation to an Academy or Academies, within the Academy Trust, in accordance with the Articles. "Parents" means parents1 or guardians.

"Predecessor School" means the school which the Academy in question replaced, where applicable.

"Publicly Funded Assets" means (a) assets or property funded wholly or partly using payments made by or on behalf of the Secretary of State, and (b) publicly funded land as defined in paragraph 22(3) of Schedule 1 to the Academies Act 2010.

"Pupil Premium" means an amount equivalent to the pupil premium as defined in the School and Early Years Finance (England) Regulations 2013

*Pupil Referral Unit" means any school established in England and maintained by a LA which is specially organised to provide education for children falling within section 19(1) of the Education Act 1996.

Any reference to "Secretary of State" includes a reference to the ESFA acting on the Secretary of State's behalf.

"Secretary of State's consent" means the Secretary of State's specific, prior written consent, which will not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

"SEN" means special educational needs and the expressions "special educational needs" and "special educational provision" have the meaning set out in sections 20(1) and 21(2) of the Children and Families Act 2014.

Start-Up Period has the meaning as defined in the relevant Supplemental Agreement.

"Supplemental Agreement" means an agreement supplemental to this Agreement for any Academy which the Academy Trust agrees to establish and maintain and the Secretary of State agrees to fund, which is substantially in the form of the supplemental funding agreement entered into by both parties at the time that this Agreement is signed.

¹ Parent has the meaning set out in section 576 of the Education Act 1996

"Teaching Staff" means teachers and the principal or head teacher employed at the Academy.

"Termination Notice" means a notice sent by the Secretary of State to the Academy Trust, terminating this Agreement and each Supplemental Agreement on the date specified in the notice.

- 1.5 The Interpretation Act 1978 applies to this Agreement as it applies to an Act of Parliament.
- 1.6 A reference in this Agreement to any party or body includes its successors.
- 1.7 Any words following the terms 'include', 'including' or 'in particular' are by way of illustration, not limitation.
- 1.8 A reference in this Agreement to land includes any buildings or structures on the land.
- 1.9 A reference in this Agreement to pupils includes students at a 16-19 Academy.
- 1.10 Where any legislation, legal requirement or published guidance is referred to, unless otherwise stated, the following terms should be interpreted as follows:
 - a) "school" refers to the relevant Mainstream Academy, Alternative Provision Academy, or Special Academy, and "educational institution" refers, where the context so admits, to a 16-19 Academy;
 - the "head teacher" may refer to the Academy's head teacher or principal;
 - references to the "governing body" or "responsible authorities" will be taken to refer to the Academy Trust; and
 - references to registered pupils will be treated as references to registered pupils at the Academy.

- 1.11 References in this Agreement or any Supplemental Agreement to any named legislation, legal requirement or published guidance should be taken to include any amendment to or replacement of it.
- 1.12 If any questions arise about how this Agreement should be interpreted, the answer will be decided by the Secretary of State, after discussion with the Academy Trust.

General Obligations of the Academy Trust

- 1.13 In order for the Academy Trust to establish and run independent schools and/or educational institutions in England, according to the terms of the Academies Act 2010, and in order for the Secretary of State to make payments to the Academy Trust, the Academy Trust must meet the conditions and requirements set out in this Agreement, and in each Supplemental Agreement for an Academy for which payments are claimed. In particular, the Academy Trust must ensure the Academies it runs meet the applicable requirements as follows:
 - for Mainstream Academies, those specified in Section 1A of the Academies Act 2010;
 - for Alternative Provision Academies, those specified in Section 1C of the Academies Act 2010;
 - for 16-19 Academies, those specified in Section 1B of the Academies Act 2010;
 - d) for Special Academies, those specified in section 1A(2) of the Academies Act 2010, and:
 - i. the Academy Trust must ensure special educational provision is made at each of the Special Academies for one or more categories of SEN. These categories may include, but are not limited to: Specific Learning Difficulties, Moderate Learning Difficulties, Severe Learning Difficulties, Profound and Multiple Learning Difficulties, Social, Emotional and Mental Health Needs,

Speech Language and Communication Needs, Autistic Spectrum Disorder, Visual Impairment, Hearing Impairment, Multi-Sensory Impairment, Physical Disability.

- ii. the Academy Trust may not refuse to admit a child or young person whose EHC Plan names one of the Special Academies on the sole basis that some, or all, of the child's or young person's SEN do not feature in the categories referred to in clause 1.13(d)(i) of this agreement.
- the Academy Trust must comply with all of the obligations imposed upon special academies by legislation.
- 1.14 To the extent that it is compatible with the Academy Trust fulfilling its charitable purpose of advancing education in the United Kingdom for the public benefit, the Academy Trust must ensure that each of its Academies is at the heart of its community, promoting community cohesion and sharing facilities with other schools and/or other educational institutions and the wider community.
- 1.15 The Academy Trust must conduct its Academies within the terms and requirements of:
 - a) the Articles;
 - any legislation or legal requirement that applies to academies, including the Independent School Standards and legislation about meeting the needs of pupils with SEN and disabilities;
 - the Academies Financial Handbook, as stated in clauses 4.6 to 4.8;
 and
 - this Agreement, and any and all Supplemental Agreements.
- 1.16 The Academy Trust must, as soon as is reasonable, establish an appropriate mechanism for the receipt and management of donations for the purpose of its aims as specified in the Articles.

- 1.17 The Academy Trust must obtain the Secretary of State's consent before applying to have an Academy designated as a school with religious character. The Secretary of State may at his discretion refuse or consent to the Academy Trust making such an application.
- 1.18 Unless an Academy operated by the Academy Trust is designated as a school with a religious character under the Religious Character of Schools (Designation Procedure) (Independent Schools) (England) Regulations 2003, it agrees to be bound by the prohibition against discrimination in section 85 of the Equality Act 2010.
- 1.19 The Academy Trust is not required to publish information under this Agreement, or any Supplemental Agreement, if to do so would breach its obligations under data protection legislation.
- 1.20 The Academy Trust must ensure that its Academies meet the needs of individual pupils, including pupils with SEN and disabilities.

Governance

- 1.21 The Academy Trust will be governed by a board comprising the Charity Trustees of the Academy Trust (the "Board of Charity Trustees").
- 1.22 The Board of Charity Trustees must have regard to any Guidance on the governance of academy trusts.
- 1.23 The Academy Trust must ensure that it engages with the relevant Local Governing Body (if any) or representatives of each Academy, and that arrangements are in place for matters relating to the functioning of each Academy to be brought to the attention of the Charity Trustees of the Academy Trust.
- 1.24 The Academy Trust must provide to the Secretary of State the names of all new or replacement members of the Academy Trust, stating the date of their appointment and, where applicable, the name of the member they replaced as soon as is practicable and in any event within 14 days of their appointment.

- 1.25 The Academy Trust must not appoint any new or replacement members until it has first informed them, and they have agreed, that their names will be shared with the Secretary of State to enable him to assess their suitability.
- 1.26 If the Academy Trust establishes and maintains a Free School, it must, in addition to its obligations under clauses 1.24 and 1.25:
 - a) provide to the Secretary of State the names of all new or replacement Charity Trustees of the Academy Trust, stating whether they have been appointed or elected, the date of their appointment or election and, where applicable, the name of the Charity Trustees they replaced as soon as is practicable and in any event within 14 days of their appointment or election; and
 - b) not appoint or elect any new or replacement Charity Trustees until it has first informed them, and they have agreed, that their names will be shared with the Secretary of State to enable him to assess their suitability.
- 1.27 The Academy Trust must not amend or remove the provisions in its Articles relating to the appointment or election or the resignation or removal of Charity Trustees or members ("the Governance Articles") without the Secretary of State's consent.
- 1.28 Before any change to the Governance Articles is proposed the Academy Trust must give notice to the Secretary of State of:
 - a) the proposed amendment or removal; and;
 - b) the reason for it.
- 1.29 If the Secretary of State consents to the proposed changes, the Academy Trust shall approve any changes to the Articles as soon as reasonably practicable and provide the Secretary of State with a copy of the amended Articles and the resolution(s) approving them.

2. RUNNING OF THE ACADEMIES

Length of school day and year

2.1 The length of the school day and year will be the responsibility of the Academy Trust and for the purpose of this paragraph "school" also means a 16-19 Academy.

Teachers and staff

- 2.2 In complying with the Independent School Standards, the Academy Trust must require enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service ("DBS") certificates as appropriate for members of staff, supply staff, members of the Academy Trust, individual Charity Trustees and the chair of the Board of Charity Trustees.
- 2.3 The Academy Trust must promptly submit to the Secretary of State, on request, the information contained in any enhanced DBS certificate that it receives.
- 2.4 The Academy Trust must designate a staff member at each Academy as responsible for promoting the educational achievement of registered pupils at the Academy who are being looked after by a LA, or are no longer looked after by a LA because of an adoption, special guardianship or child arrangements order, or because they have been adopted from 'state care' outside England and Wales, and in doing so must comply with the law, regulations and guidance that apply to maintained schools. The Academy Trust must ensure the designated person undertakes appropriate training and has regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State.
- 2.5 Teachers' pay and conditions of service at the Academies are the responsibility of the Academy Trust.
- 2.6 The Academy Trust has a statutory duty to ensure that all Teaching Staff employed at each Academy have access to the Teachers' Pension Scheme (TPS) and, in so doing, must comply with the TPS Regulations. That includes ensuring that only staff who predominantly carry out teaching work are

enrolled in the TPS – teaching work is planning and preparing lessons and courses for pupils; delivering lessons to pupils; assessing the development, progress and attainment of pupils; and reporting on the development, progress and attainment of pupils. The Board of Charity Trustees will need to give careful consideration as to whether or not executive leaders meet the TPS eligibility requirements. Details of the full range of employer duties are on the TP Employer Hub.

- 2.6.1 Access to the TPS must also be in accordance with HM Treasury's published Fair Deal guidance which sets out how pensions' issues are to be dealt with when staff are compulsorily transferred from the public sector to independent providers. The Academy Trust has a crucial role in the successful administration of the TPS and must comply with the requirements of the scheme administrator to provide accurate and timely information and also to provide pension contributions.
- 2.7 The Academy Trust must ensure that all affected staff employed by the Academy Trust other than Teaching Staff have access to the Local Government Pension Scheme and, in doing so, the Academy Trust must comply with the requirements of the scheme and with Fair Deal for staff pensions guidance published by HM Treasury. These requirements do not apply if an individual chooses to opt out in line with the relevant legal provisions.
- 2.8 Where a member of the Teaching Staff employed at an Academy applies for a teaching post at another academy, a maintained school or a further education institution, the Academy Trust must at the request of the board of governors or academy trust of that other educational institution:
 - a) advise in writing whether or not, in the previous two years, there has been any formal capability considerations or proceedings for that teacher at the Academy or the Predecessor School;
 - give written details of the concerns which gave rise to any such consideration of that teacher's capability, the duration of the proceedings and their outcome.

School meals

- 2.9 Subject to clause 2.12, the Academy Trust must provide school lunches and free school lunches in accordance with the provisions of sections 512(3) and 512ZB(1) of the Education Act 1996 as if references in sections 512 and 512ZB to a LA were to the Academy Trust and as if references to a school maintained by a LA were to any of its Academies.
- 2.10 The Academy Trust must comply with school food standards legislation as if its Academies were maintained schools.
- 2.11 Where the Academy Trust provides milk to pupils, it must be provided free of charge to pupils who would be eligible for free milk if they were pupils at a maintained school.
- 2.12 Clauses 2.9 to 2.11 do not apply to 16-19 Academies. For 16-19 Academies, the Academy Trust must comply with any Guidance in relation to free meals in the further education sector, as far as it applies to those Academies.

Pupil Premium

- 2.13 For all of its Academies eligible for Pupil Premium, and for each Financial Year, the Academy Trust must publish, on the Academy's website, information about:
 - the amount of Pupil Premium allocation that it will receive during the Academy Financial Year;
 - b) what it intends to spend the Pupil Premium allocation on;
 - what it spent its Pupil Premium allocation on in the previous Academy
 Financial Year;
 - the impact of the previous year's Pupil Premium allocation on educational attainment.
- 2.14 For all of its Academies eligible for Year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium funding, and for each Academy Financial Year, the Academy Trust must publish, on the Academy's website, information about:

- the amount of Year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium grant that it will receive during the Academy Financial Year;
- b) what it intends to spend its Year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium grant on;
- what it spent its Year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium grant on in the previous Academy Financial Year;
- d) the impact of the previous year's Year 7 literacy and numeracy catchup premium grant on educational attainment, and how that effect was assessed.

Charging

- 2.15 For all its Academies except 16-19 Academies, the Academy Trust must comply with sections 402, 450-457 and 459-462 of the Education Act 1996 with regard to public examinations, charging, providing information, inviting voluntary contributions and recovering civil debts, as if its Academies were maintained schools.
- 2.16 There must be no charge for admission to or attendance at any of the Academies, and the Academies will only charge pupils where the law allows maintained schools to charge.
- 2.17 Clause 2.16 does not prevent the Academy Trust receiving funds from a LA or a charity in respect of the admission and attendance of a pupil with SEN to an Academy.
- 2.18 Notwithstanding clause 2.16, the Academy Trust may charge people who are not registered pupils at one of its Academies for education or use of facilities.
- 2.19 Where an Academy provides a pupil with board and lodging, the Academy Trust must not charge the parent of that pupil more than the cost to the Academy Trust of providing the board and lodging, except as required by the Fees, Charges and Levies guidance in HM Treasury's publication 'Managing Public Money'.

Exclusions

- 2.20 In respect of Mainstream Academies, and Special Academies which admit pupils without EHC Plans, under clause 2.D of the Special School: supplemental funding agreement, the Academy Trust must, if asked to by a LA, enter into an agreement which has the effect that where:
 - the Academy admits a pupil who has been permanently excluded from a maintained school, the Academy itself or another academy with whom the LA has a similar agreement; or
 - b) the Academy Trust permanently excludes a pupil from the Academy; then the arrangements for payment will be the same as if the Academy were a maintained school, under Regulations made under section 47 of the Schools Standards and Framework Act 1998.

Curriculum

- 2.21 The curriculum is the responsibility of the Academy Trust.
- 2.22 The Academy Trust must ensure that the curriculum provided in each Academy to pupils up to the age of 16 is balanced and broadly based. In respect of Mainstream, Special Academies, UTCs and Studio Schools, the Academy Trust must ensure that the curriculum includes English, mathematics, science and (subject to the provisions in clause 2.V of the Mainstream academy and free school: supplemental funding agreement), (subject to the provisions in clause 2.V of the UTC and Studio School supplemental funding agreement) and (subject to the provisions in clause 2.HH-JJ of the Special School: supplemental funding agreement) religious education. In respect of Alternative Provision Academies the Academy Trust must ensure that the curriculum includes English, mathematics and science.
- 2.23 The Academy Trust must publish information in relation to the current curriculum provision at each Academy on that Academy's website, including:
 - a) the content of the curriculum;

- its approach to the curriculum;
- if applicable, the GCSE options and other Key Stage 4 qualifications offered by each Academy and, if applicable, any other qualifications offered by each Academy;
- the names of any phonics or reading schemes in operation for Key
 Stage 1 if applicable; and
- how Parents (including Parents of prospective pupils) and
 Commissioners (if applicable) can obtain further information about that
 Academy's curriculum.
- 2.24 The Academy Trust must not allow any view or theory to be taught as evidence-based if it is contrary to established scientific or historical evidence and explanations. This clause applies to all subjects taught at an Academy.
- 2.25 The Academy Trust must provide for the teaching of evolution as a comprehensive, coherent and extensively evidenced theory. In respect of any Alternative Provision Academies and 16-19 Academies, the Academy Trust must do this where relevant to the curriculum.
- 2.26 The Academy Trust must ensure the Academy actively promotes the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.
- 2.26A The Academy Trust must ensure the Academy promotes principles that support equality of opportunity for all.
- 2.27 The Academy Trust must ensure that careers guidance is provided at each of its Academies, in accordance with the requirements on maintained schools in the Education Act 1997. The Academy Trust must;
 - a) Provide independent careers guidance in accordance with Department for Education statutory guidance that has been developed in line with the eight Gatsby benchmarks of Good Career Guidance.

- b) Ensure that there is an opportunity for a range of education and training providers to access registered pupils in years 8-13 for the purpose of informing them about approved technical education qualifications or apprenticeships.
- c) Publish information about their careers programme and details of their named careers leader in accordance with The School Information (England) Regulations 2008 and the accompanying Department for Education guidance, "What academies, Free schools and colleges should publish online"

Assessment

2.28 The Academy Trust must:

- ensure that pupils and students at each of its Academies are entered for examinations, in line with the requirements on maintained schools in section 402 of the Education Act 1996;
- b) comply with the relevant Guidance, as it applies to maintained schools, in respect of each Mainstream Academy, and each Special Academy to ensure that pupils take part in assessments, and in teacher assessments of pupils' performance; and must do so for each Alternative Provision Academy unless there are exceptional reasons to do otherwise;
- ensure that students at each 16-19 Academy take part in assessments of students' performance appropriate to the qualifications offered;
- report on assessments as the Secretary of State requires, or provide any information on assessments, on the same basis that maintained schools are required to provide the information;
- for all Key Stages, allow monitoring and moderation of the Academy's assessment arrangements as required by the Secretary of State.
- 2.29 Unless specifically approved in writing by the Secretary of State, the Academy Trust must not use General Annual Grant (GAG) to offer any course of education or training which leads to a qualification, if that qualification is not

- approved by the Secretary of State for the purpose of section 96 of the Learning and Skills Act 2000.
- 2.30 Unless informed by the Secretary of State that alternative information must be published, the Academy Trust must ensure that the following information is published on the relevant Academy's website for each Mainstream Academy, for each Alternative Provision Academy, and where relevant for each Special Academy, and in respect of sub-paragraph b) where relevant for each Studio School:
 - if applicable, the Academy's most recent Key Stage 2 performance measures as published by the Secretary of State in the School and College Performance Tables, broken down as follows:
 - i. progress score in reading
 - ii. progress score in writing
 - iii. progress score in mathematics
 - iv. percentage of pupils who achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and mathematics
 - percentage of pupils who achieved at a higher standard in reading, writing and mathematics
 - vi. average 'scaled score' in reading
 - vii. average 'scaled score' in mathematics
 - b) if applicable, the Academy's most recent Key Stage 4 performance measures as published by the Secretary of State in the School and College Performance Tables, broken down as follows:
 - i. Progress 8 score
 - ii. percentage of pupils entering the English Baccalaureate (EBacc)

- iii. English Baccalaureate (EBacc) Average Point Score
- iv. Attainment 8 score
- percentage of pupils achieving grade 5 or above in GCSE English and mathematics
- vi. percentage of pupils staying in education or going into employment after Key Stage 4 (pupil destinations)
- c) where applicable, the Academy's most recent 16-18 performance measures, as published by the Secretary of State in the School and College Performance Tables, broken down as follows:
 - i. progress
 - ii. attainment
 - iii. English and mathematics progress
 - iv. retention
 - v. destinations
- d) information about where and how Parents (including Parents of prospective pupils) can access the most recent report about the Academy published by the Chief Inspector; and
- e) information as to where and how Parents (including Parents of prospective pupils) can access the School and College Performance Tables published by the Secretary of State.
- 2.31 The Academy Trust must ensure that, in relation to any 16-19 Academies, any performance information requested by the Secretary of State is published on the Academy's website.
- 2.32 The Secretary of State may direct any Academy to participate in international education surveys, under the Education Act 1996, as if it were a maintained school.

GRANT FUNDING

Recurrent Expenditure Grants

- 3.1 The Secretary of State will pay grants towards Recurrent Expenditure, and may pay grants towards Capital Expenditure, for each Academy.
- 3.2 "Recurrent Expenditure" means any money spent on the establishment, conduct, administration and maintenance of an Academy which does not fall within Capital Expenditure.
- 3.3 In respect of Recurrent Expenditure, the Secretary of State will pay General Annual Grant ("GAG") and may additionally pay Earmarked Annual Grant ("EAG"). These are two separate and distinct grants.
- 3.4 Except with the Secretary of State's consent, the Academy Trust must not make commitments to spending which will have substantial implications for future grant. No decision by the Academy Trust will commit the Secretary of State to paying any particular amount of grant.

Capital Grant

- 3.5 The Secretary of State may pay a grant ("Capital Grant") to the Academy Trust for the purpose of spending on items of Capital Expenditure.
- 3.6 "Capital Expenditure" means expenditure on:
 - a) acquiring land and buildings;
 - erecting, enlarging, improving or demolishing any building including fixed plant, installation, wall, fence or other structure, or any playground or hard standing;
 - installing electrical, mechanical or other services other than necessary repairs and maintenance due to normal wear and tear;
 - d) buying vehicles;

- e) installing and equipping premises with furnishings and equipment, other than necessary repairs and maintenance due to normal wear and tear;
- installing and equipping premises with computers, networking for computers, operating software and ICT equipment, other than necessary updates or repairs and maintenance due to normal wear and tear;
- providing and equipping premises, including playing fields and other facilities for social activities and physical recreation other than necessary repairs and maintenance due to normal wear and tear;
- works of a permanent character other than the purchase or replacement of minor day-to-day items;
- any major repairs or replacements which are specified as capital expenditure in any grant letter relating to them;
- such other items (whether like or unlike any of the foregoing) of a substantial or enduring nature which the Secretary of State agrees are capital expenditure for the purposes of this Agreement;
- k) professional fees properly and reasonably incurred in connection with the provision of any of the above;
- VAT and other taxes payable on any of the above.
- 3.7 Any Capital Grant funding that may be made available to the Academy Trust will be notified to it by the Secretary of State.
- 3.8 The Academy Trust must spend Capital Grant only on items of Capital Expenditure approved by the Secretary of State and in accordance with conditions specified by the Secretary of State. Further, the Academy Trust must provide evidence that it has obtained all planning and other consents required for any proposed building and infrastructure development to be funded using Capital Grant.

- 3.9 In order to receive payments of Capital Grant, the Academy Trust must provide supporting invoices and certificates in the format specified by the Secretary of State.
- 3.10 The Academy Trust must provide an account of Capital Grant received and associated spending on Capital Expenditure using Capital Grant in the Academy Trust's financial statements and any financial reports or returns that the Secretary of State may require.
- 3.11 If in its use of Capital Grant the Academy Trust does not comply with this Agreement or any of the conditions specified by the Secretary of State, or the project does not accord with the original specification or has not been completed, the Secretary of State may at his discretion not make any further payments of Capital Grant and require the Academy Trust to repay all or part of the Capital Grant.

General Annual Grant (GAG)

- 3.12 The Secretary of State will pay GAG to the Academy Trust towards the normal running costs or capital expenditure of each of its Academies, including:
 - teachers' salaries and related costs (including pension contributions, full and part-time Teaching Staff and payments in respect of seconded teachers);
 - non-teaching staff salaries and related costs (including pension contributions);
 - c) employees' expenses;
 - buying, maintaining, repairing and replacing teaching and learning materials and other educational equipment, including books and stationery;
 - buying, maintaining, repairing and replacing other assets including ICT equipment and software, sports equipment and laboratory equipment and materials;

- f) examination fees;
- g) repairs, servicing and maintenance of buildings (including redecoration, heating, plumbing, lighting etc.); maintenance of grounds (including boundary fences and walls); insurance; cleaning materials and contract cleaning; water and sewerage; fuel and light (including electricity and gas); rents; rates; purchase, maintenance, repairs and replacement of furniture and fittings;
- h) medical equipment and supplies;
- staff development (including in-service training);
- j) curriculum development;
- the costs of providing school meals for pupils (including the cost of providing free school lunches to pupils who are eligible to receive them), and any discretionary grants to pupils to meet the cost of pupil support, including support for pupils with SEN and disabilities;
- administration; and
- m) establishment expenses and other institutional costs.
- 3.13 GAG for each Academy Financial Year for each Mainstream Academy and Special Academy will include:
 - funding equivalent to that which would be received by a maintained school with similar characteristics, determined by the Secretary of State and taking account of the number of pupils at the Academy;
 - funding to cover necessary functions which would be carried out by the relevant LA if the Academy were a maintained school;
 - payment of any additional specific grants made available to maintained schools, where the Academy meets the criteria for those grants, and at the Secretary of State's discretion; and

- funding for any other costs to the Academy which the Secretary of State considers necessary.
- 3.14 The Academy Trust must use GAG only for maintaining, carrying on, managing and developing the Academies in accordance with this Agreement and the relevant Supplemental Agreement, except where the Secretary of State has given specific consent for the Academy Trust to use GAG for another charitable purpose.
- 3.15 In particular (but without limitation) the Academy Trust must not use GAG for:
 - education and training for adults who are not pupils of the Academies,
 other than staff professional development and governance training and development;
 - nursery provision for which Parents are charged a fee;
 - nursery provision to children outside of the relevant Academy's age range as stated in the applicable Supplemental Agreement;
 - d) Children's Centres;
 - e) any additional cost of providing sport and leisure facilities for a purpose not permitted in clause 3.14.

Earmarked Annual Grant (EAG)

- 3.16 The Secretary of State may pay EAG to the Academy Trust for specific purposes, agreed between the Secretary of State and the Academy Trust, and as described in the relevant funding letter. The Academy Trust must spend EAG only in accordance with that letter.
- 3.17 Where the Academy Trust is seeking a specific EAG for any Academy Financial Year, it must send a letter outlining its proposals and the reasons for the request to the Department for Education.

Arrangements for paying GAG and EAG

- 3.18 Before each Academy Financial Year, the Secretary of State will notify the Academy Trust of the GAG and EAG amounts in respect of each Academy which, subject to parliamentary approval, the Secretary of State plans for that Academy Financial Year and how these have been calculated.
- 3.19 The amounts of GAG for an Academy Financial Year will be determined annually by the Secretary of State, and notified to the Academy Trust in a funding letter sent before the relevant Academy Financial Year begins (the "Annual Letter of Funding").
- 3.20 Amounts of EAG will be notified to the Academy Trust wherever possible in the Annual Letter of Funding or as soon as is practicable afterwards.
- 3.21 The Annual Letter of Funding will, as well as stating the grant amounts, set out how these have been calculated. It will not include grants which cannot be calculated in time because there is not enough information, or for other administrative reasons. Any such grants will be notified as soon as practicable.
- 3.22 The Secretary of State will pay GAG in monthly instalments on or before first day of each month ("the relevant month"), to fund the salaries and other payroll costs of all monthly paid employees and all other costs payable during the relevant month. The detailed arrangements for payment will be set out in the Annual Letter of Funding, or an equivalent.

3.23 If GAG or EAG is miscalculated:

- because of a mistake by the Secretary of State, which leads to an underpayment to the Academy Trust, the Secretary of State will correct the underpayment in the same or subsequent Academy Financial Years;
- b) because the Academy Trust provided incorrect information, which leads to an underpayment to the Academy Trust, the Secretary of State may

- correct the underpayment in the same or subsequent Academy Financial Years;
- c) for any reason which results in an overpayment to the Academy Trust, the Secretary of State may recover any overpaid grant in the same or subsequent Academy Financial Years, having considered all the relevant circumstances and taking into account any representations from the Academy Trust.

Other relevant funding

3.24. The Academy Trust may receive additional funding from a LA under an agreement with that LA for the provision of support for pupils with SEN who require high levels of such support. The Academy Trust must ensure that all support required under that agreement is provided for those pupils.

4. FINANCIAL AND ACCOUNTING REQUIREMENTS

General

- 4.1 In order for the Secretary of State to provide grant funding to the Academy Trust, the Academy Trust must be fulfilling the financial and reporting requirements in this Agreement, and any Supplemental Agreements.
- 4.2 In its conduct and operation, the Academy Trust must apply financial and other controls which meet the requirements of regularity, propriety and value for money.
- 4.3 The Academy Trust must appoint an accounting officer and must notify the Secretary of State of that appointment. The Academy Trust must assign to the accounting officer the responsibilities of the role set out in the Academies Financial Handbook and HM Treasury's publication 'Managing Public Money'.
- 4.4 The Academy Trust must abide by the requirements of, and have regard to the guidance for, charities and Charity Trustees issued by the Charity Commission and, in particular, the Charity Commission's guidance on 'Protecting Charities from Harm'. Any references in this document which

- require Charity Trustees to report to the Charity Commission should instead be interpreted as reporting to the body or person appointed as the principal regulator under the Charities Act 2011.
- 4.5 The Academy Trust must abide by the requirements of the current 16-19 Funding Guidance published by the Secretary of State, in respect of any provision for students who are above compulsory school age until the academic year in which they reach the age of 19.
- 4.5A If the Secretary of State pays any grant to or on behalf of the Academy Trust, in respect of any Free Schools that the Academy Trust establishes and maintains, which includes an amount to cover VAT, the Academy Trust shall, having paid the VAT, promptly submit a VAT reclaim application to Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs (HMRC). Any failure by the Academy Trust to submit a VAT reclaim application to HMRC, or to pursue the application diligently, or to repay any reclaimed amount to the Secretary of State as soon as reasonably practicable following receipt will be taken into account by the Secretary of State in:
 - a) calculating and paying any subsequent grant to the Academy Trust, or
 - adjusting GAG payable to the Academy Trust in subsequent Academy
 Financial Years.

Application of the Academies Financial Handbook

- 4.6 In relation to the use of grant paid to the Academy Trust by the Secretary of State, the Academy Trust must follow the requirements of, and have regard to the guidance in, the Academies Financial Handbook.
- 4.7 The Academy Trust must have adequate insurance cover or opt in to the Department for Education's arrangements as set out in the Academies Financial Handbook.
- 4.8 The Academy Trust must submit information about its finances to the Secretary of State in accordance with the Academies Financial Handbook, or as otherwise specified by the Secretary of State.

Budgeting for funds

- 4.9 The Academy Trust must balance its budget from each Academy Financial Year to the next. For the avoidance of doubt, this does not prevent the Academy Trust from:
 - subject to clause 4.14, carrying a surplus from one Academy Financial
 Year to the next; or
 - carrying forward from previous Academy Financial Years sufficient cumulative surpluses on grants from the Secretary of State to meet an in-year deficit on such grants in a subsequent financial year, in accordance with clauses 4.14-4.16 and 3.L of the relevant Supplemental Agreement; or
 - c) incurring an in-year deficit on funds from sources other than grants from the Secretary of State in any Academy Financial Year, provided it does not affect the Academy Trust's responsibility to ensure that its Academies balance their respective overall budgets from each Academy Financial Year to the next.
- 4.10 The Academy Trust may spend or accumulate funds from private sources or public sources other than grants from the Secretary of State for the benefit of the Academy Trust as it sees fit. Any surplus from private or public sources other than grants from the Secretary of State must be separately identified in the Academy Trust's accounts.
- 4.11 For clarity, and in accordance with the intent of parity of funding with LA maintained schools, in circumstances where a Predecessor School had a deficit balance and the Department for Education has settled this with the relevant LA, that amount will be recovered from the Academy Trust's GAG over a period not normally exceeding 3 years (unless the Secretary of State in his discretion decides otherwise) after the Academy opened.
- 4.12 The Academy Trust's budget must be approved for each Academy Financial Year by the Board of Charity Trustees.

4.13 The approved budget must be submitted to the Secretary of State in a form, and by a date, to be notified by the Secretary of State.

Carrying forward of funds

- 4.14 At the end of any Academy Financial Year the Academy Trust may carry forward unspent GAG from previous Academy Financial Years without limit (unless a limit is specified in the Academies Financial Handbook, or otherwise as specified in writing by the Secretary of State, in which case that limit will apply).
- 4.15 The Academy Trust must use any GAG carried forward only for purposes of GAG as set out in this agreement, or otherwise as specified in the Academies Financial Handbook or in writing by the Secretary of State.
- 4.16 Any additional grant provided for an Academy's Start-Up Period may be carried forward, without limitation or deduction, until the Start-Up Period ends.
- 4.17 Any unspent grant not allowed to be carried forward under clauses 4.14-4.16 and 3.L of the relevant Supplemental Agreement may be taken into account in the payment of subsequent grant.

Annual accounts and audit

- 4.18 The Academy Trust must prepare and file with Companies House the annual reports and accounts required by the Companies Act 2006.
- 4.19 In addition, the Academy Trust must prepare its annual reports and accounts for each Academy Financial Year:
 - in accordance with the Charity Commission's 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice', as if the Academy Trust was a registered charity; and
 - otherwise as the Secretary of State directs.
- 4.20 The Academy Trust's accounts must be audited annually by independent auditors appointed in line with the Academies Financial Handbook.

- 4.21 The accounts must carry an audit report stating whether, in the opinion of the auditors, the accounts show a true and fair view of the Academy Trust's affairs. The accounts must also be supported by such other audit reports, relating to the use of grants and other matters, as the Secretary of State directs.
- 4.22 The Academy Trust's annual report must include the names of all members of the Academy Trust who served during the year.
- 4.23 The Academy Trust's annual reports and accounts, and the auditor's reports, must be submitted to the Secretary of State by 31 December each Academy Financial Year, or as otherwise specified by the Secretary of State. The Academy Trust must publish on its website its annual reports and accounts, current memorandum of association, Articles, this Agreement, any Supplemental Agreements and the names of its Charity Trustees and members. The Secretary of State may also publish the Academy Trust's annual reports and accounts, and the audit report, as he sees fit.

Keeping financial records

4.24 The Academy Trust must keep proper accounting records. Statements of income and expenditure, statements of cash flow and balance sheets must be produced in such form and frequency as the Secretary of State directs.

Access to financial records

4.25 The books of accounts and all relevant records, files and reports of the Academy Trust, including those relating to financial controls, must be open at all reasonable times to officials of the Department for Education and the National Audit Office, and to their agents and contractors, for inspection or carrying out value for money studies. The Academy Trust must give those officials and contractors reasonable assistance with their enquiries. For the purposes of this clause 'relevant' means in any way relevant to the provision and use of grants provided by the Secretary of State under this Agreement.

4.26 The Secretary of State may, at his expense, instruct auditors to report to him on the adequacy and effectiveness of the Academy Trust's accounting systems and internal controls to standards determined by the Secretary of State, and to make recommendations for improving the Academy Trust's financial management.

Acquiring and disposing of Publicly Funded Assets

- 4.27 In relation to Publicly Funded Assets, the Academy Trust must not, without the Secretary of State's consent:
 - a) acquire or dispose of freehold land; or
 - b) take up or grant a leasehold of land; or
 - dispose of any other class of capital assets.
 - except as expressly permitted in the Academies Financial Handbook, and subject to Part 3 of Schedule 1 to the Academies Act 2010.
- 4.28 The Academy Trust must give the Secretary of State 30 days' notice of its intention to take any of the actions in clause 4.27 (a) – (c) regardless of whether the Secretary of State's consent is required.

Retention of proceeds from the disposal of capital assets

- 4.29 Except as permitted in the Academies Financial Handbook, if the Academy Trust sells capital assets which were acquired or enhanced wholly or partly using payments made by or on behalf of HM Government the Academy Trust must pay to the Secretary of State, at his request, an amount of the sale proceeds equivalent to the proportion of the original cost of the acquisition or enhancement which was met by or on behalf of HM Government.
- 4.30 If the Academy Trust sells a capital asset which was transferred to it for no or nominal consideration from a LA, a Predecessor School or a Predecessor School's foundation, the Academy Trust must, if required by the Secretary of State, pay all or part of the sale proceeds to the LA or to the Secretary of

State, taking into account the amount of the proceeds to be reinvested by the Academy Trust.

Transactions outside the usual planned range

- 4.31 In relation to Publicly Funded Assets, the Academy Trust must not, without the Secretary of State's consent:
 - give any guarantees, indemnities or letters of comfort, except such as are given in normal contractual relations;
 - b) write off any debts or liabilities owed to it; or
 - offer to make any special payments as defined in HM Treasury's publication 'Managing Public Money' (including ex gratia payments, staff severance payments and compensation payments)

if the value of those transactions would be above any threshold specified in the Academies Financial Handbook.

- 4.32 The Academy Trust must give the Secretary of State 30 days' notice (or such shorter period as the Secretary of State may agree) of its intention to take any of the actions in clause 4.31 (a) – (c) regardless of whether the Secretary of State's consent is required.
- 4.33 The Academy Trust must promptly notify the Secretary of State of any loss arising from suspected theft or fraud in line with the requirements in the Academies Financial Handbook, or otherwise specified by the Secretary of State.

Borrowing

4.34 Except as permitted in the Academies Financial Handbook, the Academy Trust must not borrow against Publicly Funded Assets, or so as to put Publicly Funded Assets at risk, without the Secretary of State's consent.

COMPLAINTS

- 5.1 With regards to a Mainstream Academy, a Special Academy an Alternative Provision Academy or a 16-19 Academy, if a complaint is made about matters arising wholly or partly before the Academy opened, and all or part of that complaint was investigated by the Local Government Ombudsman under Part III of the Local Government Act 1974 ("Part III"), or could have been investigated under Part III if the Predecessor School/Pupil Referral Unit had remained a maintained school/Pupil Referral Unit, the Academy Trust:
 - must abide by the provisions of Part III as if the Academy were a maintained school/Pupil Referral Unit;
 - agrees that the Secretary of State will have the power to investigate the subject of the complaint as if it had taken place after the Academy opened; and
 - c) must act in accordance with any recommendation from the Secretary of State as if that recommendation had been made under Part III and the Academy were a maintained school/Pupil Referral Unit.
- 5.2 With regards to a Mainstream Academy, a Special Academy or a 16-19 Academy, if the Secretary of State could have given an order or a direction under section 496 or 497 of the Education Act 1996 to the governing body of the Predecessor School and that order or direction related to matters occurring within the 12 months immediately before the Academy opened, the Academy Trust;
 - a) agrees that the Secretary of State may give orders or directions to the Academy Trust as though the Academy were a maintained school and sections 496 and 497 applied to the governing body of that maintained school; and
 - must act in accordance with any such order or direction from the Secretary of State.

- 5.3 If at the time of the opening of any Mainstream Academy, Special Academy, Alternative Provision Academy or 16-19 Academy the investigation of a complaint made to the governing body of the Predecessor School/Pupil Referral Unit has not yet been completed, the Academy Trust must continue to investigate that complaint in accordance with the complaints procedures established by that governing body.
- 5.4 If a complaint is made to the Academy Trust about matters arising in whole or in part during the 12 months prior to the opening of any Mainstream Academy, any Special Academy any Alternative Provision Academy or any 16-19 Academy the Academy Trust agrees to investigate that complaint as if the matter complained of had taken place after the Academy opened.

TERMINATION

6.1 This Agreement will commence on the date of delivery and continue until terminated in accordance with clauses 6.2-6.7, or until all Supplemental Agreements have terminated.

Termination by the Secretary of State

- 6.2 The Secretary of State may serve a Termination Notice if any of the following events occur, or if he considers that there is a serious risk that any of them may occur:
 - the Academy Trust calls a formal or informal meeting of its creditors or enters into any formal or informal composition or arrangement with its creditors; or
 - the Academy Trust proposes a voluntary arrangement within Section 1 of the Insolvency Act 1986 (as amended); or
 - c) the Academy Trust is unable to pay its debts within the meaning of Section 123 of the Insolvency Act 1986 provided that, for the purposes of this clause, Section 123 (1)(a) of the Insolvency Act 1986 will have effect as if £10,000 was substituted for £750. The Academy Trust will not be deemed unable to pay its debts for the purposes of this clause if

- any such demand as is mentioned in the said Section is being contested in good faith by the Academy Trust; or
- the Academy Trust has a receiver and manager (except those appointed by the Charity Commission under the Charities Act 2011), administrator or administrative receiver appointed over all or part of its undertakings, assets or income; or
- any distraint, execution or other process is levied or enforced on any of the Academy Trust's property and is not paid out, withdrawn or discharged within 15 Business Days; or
- f) the Academy Trust has passed a resolution for its winding up; or
- g) an order is made for the winding up or administration of the Academy Trust.
- 6.3 The Academy Trust must promptly notify the Secretary of State, with an explanation of the circumstances, after receiving any petition which may result in an order for its winding up or administration.

6.4 If

- any Charity Trustee or member of the Academy Trust refuses to consent to any checks required under this Agreement, or as otherwise requested by the Secretary of State; or
- the Secretary of State determines that any Charity Trustee or member of the Academy Trust is unsuitable,

the Secretary of State may:

- direct the Academy Trust to ensure that the Charity Trustee or member resigns or is removed within 42 days, failing which the Secretary of State may serve a Termination Notice; or
- ii. serve a Termination Notice.

- 6.5 For the purposes of clause 6.4 a Charity Trustee or member of the Academy Trust will be "unsuitable" if that Charity Trustee or member:
 - a) has been convicted of an offence;
 - b) has been given a caution in respect of an offence;
 - is subject to a relevant finding in respect of an offence; or
 - d) has engaged in relevant conduct,

as a result of which, the Secretary of State considers that that Charity Trustee or member is unsuitable to take part in the management of the Academies.

- 6.6 For the purposes of clause 6.5:
 - a) a Charity Trustee or member of the Academy Trust will be subject to a "relevant finding" in respect of an offence if:
 - that Charity Trustee or member has been found not guilty of the offence by reason of insanity;
 - ii. that Charity Trustee or member has been found to be under a disability and to have done the act charged against them in respect of the offence; or
 - iii. a court outside the United Kingdom has made a finding equivalent to that described in paragraphs (i) and (ii) above.
 - b) "relevant conduct" is conduct by a Charity Trustee or member of the Academy Trust which is:
 - aimed at undermining the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs; or
 - found to be in breach of professional standards by a professional body; or

iii. so inappropriate that, in the opinion of the Secretary of State, it makes that Charity Trustee or member unsuitable to take part in the management of the Academy.

Change of Control of the Academy Trust

- 6.7 The Secretary of State may at any time, subject to clause 6.8, serve a Termination Notice if there is a change:
 - a) in the Control of the Academy Trust; or
 - in the Control of a legal entity that Controls the Academy Trust.
- 6.8 Where a person ('P') is a member or director of a body corporate (as a corporation sole or otherwise) by virtue of an office, no change of Control arises merely by P's successor becoming a member or director in P's place.
- 6.9 The Academy Trust must promptly notify the Secretary of State if there is a proposed or actual change of Control of the Academy Trust, or of a legal entity that Controls the Academy Trust.
- 6.10 When notifying the Secretary of State further to clause 6.9, the Academy Trust must seek his agreement that, if he is satisfied with the change of Control, he will not exercise his right to terminate this Agreement further to clause 6.7.

7. OTHER CONTRACTUAL ARRANGEMENTS

Information

- 7.1 The Academy Trust must promptly provide to the Secretary of State any information about the Academy Trust, or any of its Academies, which he regards as necessary to fulfil his role and responsibilities.
- 7.2 The Secretary of State will give the Academy Trust any information it reasonably requires of him for the running of its Academies.

Access by the Secretary of State's Officers

- 7.3 The Academy Trust must allow Department for Education officials to enter any of its Academies at any reasonable time. All records, files and reports relating to the running of each Academy must be available to them at any reasonable time. Two Department for Education officials may attend and speak at any meetings of each Academy's Local Governing Body, of the Academy Trust's Board of Charity Trustees or any other meetings of the Charity Trustees of the Academy Trust, but will withdraw from any discussion of an Academy's or the Academy Trust's relationship with the Secretary of State or any discussion of bids for funding to the Secretary of State.
- 7.4 The following documents must be provided to the Secretary of State or any person nominated by the Secretary of State on request:
 - the agenda for every meeting of the Board of Charity Trustees, any Local Governing Body or any committee to which the Board of Charity Trustees delegates any of its functions;
 - the draft minutes of every such meeting, if they have been approved by the chairman of that meeting;
 - the signed minutes of every such meeting; and
 - any report, document or other paper considered at any such meeting.
- 7.5 The Academy Trust may exclude from items provided under clause 7.4 any content relating to:
 - a named teacher or other person employed, or proposed to be employed, at any Academy;
 - a named pupil or student at, or candidate for admission to, any Academy; and
 - any matter which the Academy Trust reasonably believes should remain confidential.

Information Sharing with Local Authorities - Statutory Responsibilities

- 7.5A The Academy Trust must provide:
 - a) the name, address and date of birth of the pupil or student;
 - the name and address of a parent of the pupil or student;
 - c) information in the institution's possession about the pupil or student (except if the pupil or student concerned (in the case of a pupil or student who has attained the age of 16) or a parent of the pupil or student concerned (in the case of a pupil or student who has not attained the age of 16) has instructed the Academy Trust not to provide information of that kind);

upon request under section 14 of the Education and Skills Act 2008 from a LA (for the purpose of enabling or assisting it to exercise its functions under Part 1 of that Act); or

upon request under section 72 of that Act from a body providing services under sections 68 or 70(1)(b) of the Act (for the purposes of providing such services).

Notices

- 7.6 A notice or communication given to a party in connection with this Agreement or any Supplemental Agreement:
 - must be in writing (excluding email, except where agreed in advance)
 and in English;
 - must be delivered by hand or sent by pre-paid first-class post or other next Business Day delivery service;
 - will be deemed to have been received:
 - if delivered by hand, at the time when a delivery receipt is signed or when the notice is left at the address in paragraph (d), or
 - ii. if posted, at 9.00am on the second Business Day after posting;
 and

d) must be sent to the party for the attention of the contact and at the address listed as follows (or to a different contact or address previously notified to the sending party, the change taking effect five Business Days after deemed receipt of the notice):

Contractual

- 7.7 This Academy Trust cannot assign this Agreement.
- 7.8 Failure to exercise, or delay in exercising, any right or remedy of the Secretary of State under this Agreement (including the right to terminate this Agreement), or a single or partial exercise of such a right or remedy, is not a waiver of, and does not prevent or restrict any initial or further exercise of, that or any other right or remedy.
- 7.9 Termination of this Agreement will not affect the accrued rights, remedies, obligations or liabilities of the parties to this Agreement existing at termination.
- 7.10 This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which when executed and delivered will constitute a duplicate original, but all of which will together constitute the same agreement.

Birmingham is supplemental to the master funding agreement made between the same parties and dated 29 October 2012 as varied by a Deed of Variation dated 29 Ontober 2016 and a further Doed of Variation dated (the "Master Agreement").



The Children and Families Act 2014 imposes duties directly on Adademics in respect of pupils with SEN, including the admission of pupils with EHC plans. If an Adademy Trust considers that a LA should not have named the Adademy in an EHC plan, it may ask the Sacretary of State to determine whether the LA has acted unreasonably, and to make an order directing the LA to recursider. The Adademy Trust must admit the pupil if such a determination is pending. taking into account all other resources likely to be available to the Academy, including other funds that are likely to be available to the Academy from other academies operated by the Academy Trust ("All Other Resources"), it is likely that the cost of running the Academy during the Critical Year would cause the Academy Trust to become insolvent (and for this reason only) then the Academy Trust may give written notice of its intention to terminate this Agraement on 31 August before the Critical Year.

- Any notice given by the Academy Trust under clause 5.5 must be provided to the Secretary of State within six weeks of the Secretary of State sauling the Funding Allocation. The notice given by the Academy Trust under clause 5.5 must specify:
 - a) the grounds upon which the Academy Trust's opinion is based, including:
 - i, evidence of those grounds;
 - ii. any professional accounting advice the Academy Trust has received;
 - iii. a detailed statement of steps which the Academy Trust proposes to take to ensure that the running costs of the Academy are reduced such that costs are less than the Funding Allocation and All Other Resources, and the period of time within which such steps will be taken; and
 - b) the shortfall in the Critical Year between the Funding Allocation and All Other Resources expected to be available to the Academy Trust to run the Academy and the projected expenditure on the Academy; and
 - a detailed budget of income and expenditure for the Academy during the Critical Year (the 'Projected Budget').

- 5.0 Both parties will use their best endeavours to agree whether or not the cost of running the Academy during the Critical Year would cause the Academy Trust to become insolvent. Both parties recognise that they will need to engage in a constructive dialogue at the time about how best to provide education for the publis at the Academy and use their best endeavours to agree a practical solution to the problem.
- If no agreement is reached by 30 April (or another date if agreed between the parties) as to whether the cost of running the Academy during the Chical Year would cause the Academy Trust to become insolvent, then that question will be referred to an independent expert (the "**Expert**") for resolution. The Expert's determination will be final and binding on both parties. The Expert will be requested to specify in his determination the amount of the shortfall in funding (the "Shortfall").
- 5 W The Expert will be an insolvency practitioner with significant professional experience of educational institutions or academies. If the parties fail to agree upon the appointment of the Expert than the Expert will be appointed by the President of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.

 The Expert's fees will be borne equally between the parties.
- 5.X The Expert will be required in reaching his determination to take account of advice from an educational specialist who is professionally familiar with the issues arising from the budget management of schools. If the parties fail to agree upon the appointment of the educational specialist than the educational specialist will be appointed by the Chairman of the Specialist Schools and Academies Trust (or any successor or equivalent body). The educational specialist's fees will be borne equally between the parties.
- 5.Y If the Expert determines that the cost of running the Academy during the Critica: Year would cause the Academy Trust to become insolvent, and the Secretary of State will not have agreed to provide sufficient additional furnishing to cover the Shortfall, then the Academy Trust will be entitled to terminate this Agreement, by notice expiring on 31 August before the Critical Year. Any such notice will be given within 21 days after (a) the Expert's determination

will have been given to the parties or (b), if later, the Societary of State will have given written notice of his refusal to provide sufficient additional funding for the Academy to cover the Shortfail.

Effect of termination

- 5.Z If this Agreement is terminated, the Academy will cease to be an Academy within the meaning of sections 1 and 1A of the Academios Act 2010
- 5.AA Subject to clauses 5.BB and 5.CC, if the Secretary of State ferminates this Agreement under clause 5.A, he will indomnify the Academy Trust. If the Secretary of State terminates this Agreement otherwise than under clause 5.A, he may at his discretion indemnify or compensate the Academy Trust.
- 5.BB The amount of any such indemnity or compensation will be dotermined by the Secretary of State, having regard to representations made to him by the Academy Trust, and will be paid as and when the Secretary of State considers appropriate.
- 5.CC The categories of expanditure incurrent by the Academy Trust in consequence of termination, for which the Secretary of State may indemnify the Academy Trust under clauses 5.AA, may include:
 - staff compensation and redundancy payments;
 - b) compensation payments in respect of broken contracts;
 - axpenses of disposing of assets or adapting them for other purposes;
 - d) legal and other professional fees, and
 - e) dissolution expenses.
- 6.DD If this Agreement is terminated, and the Adademy Trust owns capital assets which have been partly or wholly funded by HM Government, the Adademy Trust must, as soon as possible after the termination date:
 - a) transfer a proportion of these capital assets, equal to the proportion of the original financial contribution made by HM Government, to a

- nomings of the Secretary of State to use for educational purposes; or
- if the Secretary of State directs that a transfer under clause 5 DD(a) is not required, pay to the Secretary of State at the termination date (or, by agreement with the Secretary of State, at the date of their subsequent disposal) a sum equivalent to the proportion of the original financial contribution made by HM Government.

5.EE. The Secretary of State may.

- a) waive all or part of the repayment due under sub-clause 5.DD(b) if the Academy Trust obtains his permission to invest the sale proceeds for its charitable purposes, or
- b) direct the Academy Trust to pay all or pail of the sale proceeds to the relevant LA

6. OTHER CONTRACTUAL ARRANGEMENTS

The Master Agreement

6.B Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, all provisions of the Master Agreement have full force and effect.

General

- 6.0 The Academy Trust cannot assign this Agreement.
- Failure to exercise, or a delay in exercising, any right or remedy of the Secretary of State under this Agreement (including the right to terminate this Agreement), or a single or partial exercise of such a right or remedy is not a waiver of, and does not prevent or restrict any initial or further exercise of, that or any other right or remody.

- GET Termination of this Agreement will not affect the socrued rights, remedies abligations or liabilities of the parties existing at termination.
- 8.F This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which when executed and delivered shall constitute a duplicate uriginal, but all of which will together constitute the same agreement.
- 6.G This Agreement and any disputs or claim arising out of or in connection with it or its subject matter or formation (including non-contractual disputes or claims) shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the 'aw of England and Wales, and submitted to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of England and Wales.
- The Secretary of State agrees that this Agreement shall be interpreted in a way which is compatible with the provisions of clauses 20-20F and 23A-G (it used) of the Church Supplemental Agreement dated 29 October 2015 and made between (1) the Secretary of State; (2) the Adademy Trust; (3) The Birmingham Diocesan Trust; and (4) The Board of education of the Diocesa of Birmingham.

Information Sharing with Local Authorities – Statutory Responsibilities

- 6.1 The Academy Trust must provide:
 - a) the name, address and date of birth of the publi or student;
 - b) the name and address of a perent of the pupil or student;
 - c) information in the institution's possession about the pupil or student (except if the pupil or student concerned (in the case of a pupil or student who has attained the age of 16) or a parent of the pupil or student concerned (in the case of a pupil or student who has not attained the age of 16) has instructed the Academy Trust not to provide information of that kind);

upon request under section 14 of the Education and Skills Act 2008 from a local authority (for the purpose of enabling or assisting it to exercise its functions under Part 1 of that Act); or

upon request under section 72 of that Δct from a body providing services under sections 68 at 70(1)(0) of the Δct (for the purposes of providing such sorvices)

ANNEXES

Annex A

ADMISSION OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE WITH EDUCATION, HEALTH AND CARE PLANS

*EHC Plan" means an education, health and care plan made under section 37 of the Children and Families Act 2014.

The Children and Families Act 2014 imposes duties directly on Academies in respect of pupils with SEN, including the admission of pupils with EHC plans. If an Academy Trust considers that a LA should not have named the Academy in an EHC plan, it may ask the Secretary of State to determine whather the LA has acted unreasonably, and to make an order directing the LA to reconsider. The Academy Trust must admit the pupil it such a determination is pending. The Socretary of State's determination as to whether the LA acted unreasonably will be final, subject to any right of appeal which a pupil (who is aver compulsory school age) or parent of the pupil may have to the First-tier Tribunal (Special Educational Needs and Orsability) or the Upper Tribunal Administrative Appeals Chamber.



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
