

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<p>Topic</p>	<p><u>Winter Lesson 1:</u> To understand the difference between hot and cold.</p> <p>In this set of lessons we learn about the coldest season Winter alongside recognising things that are hot and cold. In this lesson with Miss Hughes, we identify things that are hot and things that are cold. We end the lesson by conducting an experiment using ice cubes. If you want an additional layer of challenge, freeze small toys in your ice cubes and see if you can help them to break free. We will plan to go on a hot holiday or a cold holiday, making sure to pack appropriate clothes depending on the weather! We will think about the colours of the season and create a drawing of things that we can see on a winter walk.
